AN ACT TO AMEND § 11105 OF CHAPTER 11, TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ALLOWING THE PUBLIC DEFENDER SERVICE CORPORATION TO RECEIVE AND ADMINISTER GRANTS AND ENTER INTO INTRA-GOVERNMENTAL AND INTER-GOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS AND TO ESTABLISHING AN ELDER LAW CENTER WITHIN THE CORPORATION TO PROVIDE LEGAL SERVICES FOR GUAM'S ELDERLY POPULATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that there is a need to provide avenues for civil legal aid and other services to assist
- 4 Guam's elderly population. Local resources to fund these programs are limited, but
- 5 federal grants to support them may be available. I Liheslatura finds that the Public
- 6 Defender Service Corporation ("Corporation")—if allowed to apply, receive, and
- 7 administer federal grants reserved for those populations—will be uniquely situated
- 8 to fill the gaps in legal services for the vulnerable, underserved, and under-
- 9 represented members of our community who need them the most.

I Liheslatura further finds that the Corporation, the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) and the Guam Legal Services Corporation have been in talks to create an Elder Law Center ("Center") within the auspices of the Corporation. The Center would be funded by an existing \$190,000 federal grant meant to provide legal services to the elderly. The DPHSS reports that there are over 400 manåmko' (elderly) who are currently awaiting legal services that this grant could provide. I Liheslatura finds that governmental and non-profit corporations, including the Corporation, the Guam Legal Services Corporation, and the Micronesian Legal Services Corporation, are ready, willing, and able to provide services to qualified individuals with funding from this grant.

I Liheslatura further finds that to effectuate this service, the enabling language of the Corporation must be amended to clarify that, notwithstanding any existing moratoriums or existing law, the Corporation is able to apply for, received, and administer grants and subgrants, and enter into intra-governmental and intergovernmental agreements, including, but not limited to grants to provide protective orders and legal services for the elderly. I Liheslatura finds that our manåmko' (elderly), the bedrock of our community, deserve quality legal services that could be duly provided by the hard-working and diligent staff of the Corporation, whose express mission already includes the representation of people who are unable to afford an attorney in private practice.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to amend § 11105 of Chapter 11, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to allow the Public Defender Service Corporation to receive and administer grants and enter into intra-governmental and inter-governmental agreements to provide legal services for Guam's elderly population.

Section 2. § 11105, Chapter 11, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended, to read:

## "§ 11105. Same: Civil Matters.

The Corporation shall render legal aid and assistance to those persons in Guam, who, under rules established by the Corporation, are in need of legal assistance and representation and who are unable to afford an attorney in private practice. The Corporation shall not compete with attorneys engaged in the private practice of law in Guamaccept fee-generating cases and shall give legal assistance in civil matters only to those who would otherwise not receive such assistance. The Corporation may apply for, receive, and administer grants, subgrants or enter into intra-governmental and inter-governmental agreements to provide legal services to elderly individuals, as defined pursuant to local or federal laws, regulations, or guidelines. The Corporation is authorized to comply with the requirements of federal grants, subgrants, and intra-governmental and inter-governmental agreements, to include representation to individuals who may qualify for services pursuant to the terms of federal grants, subgrants, and intra-governmental and inter-governmental and inter-governmenta

**Section 3.** Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
