## AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW § 77203.1 TO ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 77, DIVISION 2, TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER TERRITORIAL PARK PATROL OFFICER RESERVE.

1	<b>BE IT ENACTE</b>	D BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
2	Section 1. A n	ew § 77203.1 is hereby added to Article 2, Chapter 77,

(a) Creation. There is hereby created within the Department of Parks and Recreation of the government of Guam the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve program, which *shall* be headed by the Director. The Director, subject to the advice and control of the Commission, *shall* be responsible for carrying out the purpose of this Section and *shall* have such additional duties as authorized herein, or as may be prescribed by the Commission.

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Functions and Duties. The general functions and duties of the 8 (b)Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve shall be to provide 9 back-up, supplemental manpower for the provision of the park protection 10 duties and services of the Department. The Director shall formulate a program 11 whereby members of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer 12 Reserve shall adhere to the functions and duties herein prescribed. From time 13 to time, the Director, with the consent of the Commission, shall review and 14 revise the functions of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer 15 Reservist to ensure an amicable discharge of responsibilities and duties 16 acknowledging the fact that their roles are an extension of the duties of the 17 regular personnel. 18

(c) Recruitment. The Director *shall* recruit, on an entirely volunteer basis, local residents who desire to make available their services to assist the Department of Parks and Recreation in carrying out its law enforcement duties and emergency functions. The Director, with the concurrence of the Commission, *shall* further promulgate rules and regulations consistent with the requirements of hiring regular Territorial Park Patrol Officers.

(d) Training, Equipment, and Maintenance Records. The Director *shall* devise a program whereby the Park Protection Section of the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Civil Defense Office will provide the

members of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve 1 with training in crime prevention and operational techniques and procedures 2 for natural and man-made emergencies. The Civilian Volunteer Territorial 3 Park Patrol Officer Reserve program shall maintain a roster of volunteers who 4 have received the training prescribed herein. In order to maintain membership 5 in the Reserve, each member must keep up with his or her scheduled training 6 and no reservist may remain in the Reserve if he or she is unable to keep up 7 with or otherwise absorb the training. Additionally, basic supplies and 8 equipment shall be provided to ensure the constant operability of the Civilian 9 Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve, including a continuing 10 program for replacement of members. 11

Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reservist: 12 (e) Authority. Whenever the members of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park 13 Patrol Officer Reserve are rendering assistance to the Territoral Park Patrol 14 Officers, such volunteers shall have the same powers, duties, rights (including 15 coverage under the Worker's Compensation Act), privileges and immunities, 16 as if they were paid, full-time members of the Department of Parks and 17 Recreation, except that they shall earn recruitment credit for services 18 19 performed as reservists.

Same: Allowance. Each member of the Civilian Volunteer (f)20 Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve who successfully completes 21 probationary requirements as established by the Director and who contributes 22 a minimum of forty-two (42) hours or more per month, shall receive an 23 allowance of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) per month to defray the costs 24 of maintenance of their equipment and uniforms. The Department of Parks 25 and Recreation shall identify funds within the Department's appropriations to 26 satisfy the intent of this Section. 27

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(g) Same: Eligibility and Oath. No person shall be a volunteer member of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve established under this Chapter who advocates a change by force or violence in the constitutional form of the Government of the United States or Guam or the overthrow of any government in the United States by force, or who has been convicted of or is under indictment or information charging any subversive act against the United States. Every reservist *shall*, upon entering his or her duties, take an oath, in writing, before a person authorized to administer oaths in Guam, which oath *shall* be substantially as follows:

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, do solemnly swear (or affirm) ۴I 10 that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United 11 States and the laws of Guam, against all enemies, foreign or 12 domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; 13 that I take this obligation freely, without any mental 14 reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and 15 faithfully discharge the duties upon which I am about to enter; 16 and I do further swear (or affirm) that I do not advocate, nor 17 am I a member of any political party or organization that 18 advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United 19 States or of Guam by force or violence." 20

(h) Rules and Regulations: Recommendations. The Director is
authorized and empowered to recommend to the Governor, with the
concurrence of the Commission, for issuance as executive orders the making,
amendment and recession of such orders, rules and regulations as may be
necessary to carry out the provisions of this Section. The Director shall also
have the authority to amend and create rules and regulations to implement and

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maintain the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve
 through the Administrative Adjudication Process.

- 3 Section 2. Effective Date. This Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.
- 4 Section 3. Severability. If any of provision of this law or its application to
- 5 any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, that invalidity
- 6 shall not affect other provisions or applications of this law, which can be given
- 7 effect without the invalid provisions or applications and to this end the provisions
- 8 of this act are severable.
