AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 5107 TO CHAPTER 5 TITLE CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE GUAM TO 4. **PROHIBITING** RETALIATION POLITICAL AND **ESTABLISHING PENALTIES** FOR THOSE WHO FORCE OR THREATEN EMPLOYEES TO ENGAGE IN POLITICAL ACTIVITY AGAINST THEIR WILL.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

- 2 Section 1. A new § 5107 is hereby *added* to Chapter 5 of Title 4, Guam
- 3 Code Annotated to read as follows:

4 <u>"§ 5107. Political Retaliation.</u>

- Notwithstanding any other provisions of the law rule, or regulation, no
 individual or Employee, inclusive of those defined pursuant to § 5101(a) of this
 Chapter, a person holding elective office, a special or Staff Assistant to the
 Governor, a person appointed by the Governor with the consent of the Legislature,
 or a member of the Governor's Cabinet, *shall* make, adopt, or enforce any rule,
 regulation, or policy which:
 (a) forbids or prevents employees from engaging or participating in
- 12 political activity or from becoming candidates for public office, as long as

1	those activities remain within the parameters stipulated, pursuant to this				
2	Chapter; or				
3	(b) controls or directs, or tends to control, or directs the political activities				
4	or affiliations of employees against their will; or				
5	(c) politically retaliates, threatens, or forces an employee with some				
6	punishment if they fail to follow any instructions associated with political				
7	activity.				
8	Any individual who violates this subsection shall be guilty of a				
9	misdemeanor, and if convicted, shall pay a fine of up to Five Thousand Dollars				
10	(\$5,000), and shall be required to perform a minimum of one hundred eighty (180)				
11	hours but not to exceed three hundred sixty (360) hours of community service."				
12	Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to				
13	any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such				
14	invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be				
15	given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the				
16	provisions of this Act are severable.				
17	Section 3. Effective Date. The Act shall be effective immediately upon				

18 enactment.
