

**AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 77203.1 TO ARTICLE 2 OF  
CHAPTER 77, DIVISION 2, TITLE 21, GUAM CODE  
ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE  
CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER TERRITORIAL PARK  
PATROL OFFICER RESERVE.**

1        **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2        **Section 1.** A new § 77203.1 is hereby *added* to Article 2 of Chapter 77,  
3 Division 2, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

4                “§ 77203.1. **Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer**  
5        **Reserve.**”

1           (a)    Creation. There is hereby created within the Department of Parks  
2 and Recreation of the government of Guam the Civilian Volunteer Territorial  
3 Park Patrol Officer Reserve Program, which shall be headed by the Director.  
4 The Director, subject to the advice and control of the Commission, shall be  
5 responsible for carrying out the purpose of this Section and shall have such  
6 additional duties as authorized herein, or as may be prescribed by the  
7 Commission.

8           (b)    Functions and Duties. The general functions and duties of the  
9 Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve shall be to provide  
10 backup, supplemental manpower for the provision of the park protection  
11 duties and services of the Department. The Director shall formulate a program  
12 whereby reservists of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer  
13 Reserve shall adhere to the functions and duties herein prescribed. From time  
14 to time, the Director, with the consent of the Commission, shall review and  
15 revise the functions of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer  
16 Reserve Program to ensure an amicable discharge of responsibilities and  
17 duties, acknowledging the fact that a reservist's role is an extension of the  
18 duties of regular personnel.

19           (c)    Recruitment. The Director shall recruit, on an entirely volunteer  
20 basis, local residents who desire to make available their services to assist the  
21 Department of Parks and Recreation in carrying out its law enforcement duties  
22 and emergency functions. The Director, with the concurrence of the  
23 Commission, shall further promulgate rules and regulations consistent with  
24 the requirements of hiring regular Territorial Park Patrol Officers.

25           (d)    Training, Equipment, and Maintenance Records. Training for  
26 reservists of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve  
27 shall be conducted pursuant to standards set forth by the Peace Officer

1 Standards and Training (POST) Commission in 17 GCA Chapter 51 and 27  
2 GARR Chapter 3. Initial training requirements shall be identical to those  
3 required of Territorial Park Patrol Officers.

4 (e) Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reservist:  
5 Authority. When the reservists of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park  
6 Patrol Officer Reserve are rendering assistance to the Territorial Park Patrol  
7 Officers, such volunteers shall have the same powers, duties, rights, including  
8 coverage under the Worker's Compensation Act, and privileges and  
9 immunities, as if they were paid full-time employees of the Department of  
10 Parks and Recreation, except that they shall earn recruitment credit for  
11 services performed as reservists.

12 (f) Allowance. Each reservist of the Civilian Volunteer Territorial  
13 Park Patrol Officer Reserve who successfully completes probationary  
14 requirements as established by the Director and who contributes a minimum  
15 of forty-two (42) hours or more per month, shall receive an allowance of Five  
16 Hundred Dollars (\$500) per month to defray the costs of maintenance of their  
17 equipment and uniforms. The Department of Parks and Recreation shall  
18 identify funds within the Department's appropriations to satisfy the intent of  
19 this Section.

20 (g) Eligibility and Oath. No person shall be a volunteer reservist of  
21 the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve established  
22 under this Section who advocates a change by force or violence in the  
23 constitutional form of the Government of the United States or Guam or the  
24 overthrow of any government in the United States by force, or who has been  
25 convicted of or is under indictment or information charging any subversive  
26 act against the United States. Every reservist shall, upon entering his or her

1 duties, take an oath, in writing, before a person authorized to administer oaths  
2 in Guam, which oath shall be substantially as follows:

3 “I \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that  
4 I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States  
5 and the laws of Guam, against all enemies, foreign or domestic;  
6 that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take  
7 this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose  
8 of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties  
9 upon which I am about to enter; and I do further swear (or affirm)  
10 that I do not advocate, nor am I a member of any political party  
11 or organization that advocates the overthrow of the Government  
12 of the United States or of Guam by force or violence.”

13 (h) Rules and Regulations: Recommendations. The Director is  
14 authorized and empowered to recommend to the Governor, with the  
15 concurrence of the Commission, for issuance as executive orders the making,  
16 amendment and recession of such orders, rules, and regulations as may be  
17 necessary to carry out the provisions of this Section. The Director shall also  
18 have the authority to amend and create rules and regulations to implement and  
19 maintain the Civilian Volunteer Territorial Park Patrol Officer Reserve  
20 through the Administrative Adjudication Law.”

21 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.

22 **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any  
23 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall  
24 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without  
25 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are  
26 severable.
