**MEMORANDUM**

**SUBJECT:** Call to Emergency Session – Wednesday, July 20, 2022 at 2:00 P.M.

*Buenas yan Hafa Adai! I Liheslaturan Guåhan* will be called into Emergency Session on **Wednesday, July 20, 2022 at 2:00 P.M.** in the **Speaker Antonio R. Unpingco Legislative Session Hall**, Guam Congress Building.

On March 14, 2020, Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*, Governor of Guam, acting pursuant to the power provided by the Organic Act of Guam and the laws of Guam, declared a public health emergency in the island of Guam due to dangers posed by the 2019 novel coronavirus ("COVID-19").

In Executive Order 2022-14, the public health emergency first declared in Executive Order No. 2020-03, and most recently extended in Executive Order No. 2022-17, was extended for an additional thirty (30) day period, effective July 5, 2022. The public health emergency is now scheduled to expire on August 4, 2022.

In light of the continuous negative economic impact from the pandemic including unemployment, increased food and housing insecurity, the rapid rise in gas prices, the significant increases to power rates at Guam Power Authority and the need to provide additional and immediate direct aid to individuals, households and businesses, I hereby certify that conditions exist involving danger to the public health or safety.

The attached request has been submitted to consider Bill No. 325-36 (COR) as a qualified measure for an emergency session. For your reference, a public hearing was conducted for Bill No. 325-36 (COR) on July 15, 2022, and a committee report is still pending. A Fiscal Impact note for Bill No. 325-36 (COR) was issued on July 12, 2022, by the Bureau of Budget & Management Research, and is attached to this notice.

In the absence of a session agenda adopted by the Committee on Rules, notice is hereby given that all introduced bills listed at ~~https://guamlegis.guam.gov/index/bills~~ are potential items to be placed on the agenda pursuant to motion, standing rules and consistent with the emergency call.



1        **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2        **Section 1.** Section 2 of Chapter I (General Provisions) of Public Law 36-54  
3        (the General Appropriations Act of 2022) is *amended* to read:

1           **“Section 2. Estimated Revenues for Fiscal Year 2022.**  
2       Notwithstanding § 22436, Chapter 22, Title 5 GCA, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*  
3       adopts the following revenue estimates for Fiscal Year 2022 as the basis for

22       **Section 2.** Section 2 of Part I, Chapter III (Health) of Public Law 36-54 (the  
23 General Appropriations Act of 2022) is *amended* to read as follows:

24               **"Section 2. GMHA Pharmaceuticals Fund Appropriation.**

25               Pursuant to §§ 26208 and 26208.1 of Article 2, Chapter 26, Title 11 GCA, the  
26 sum of Seventeen Million Nine Hundred Eighty-two Three Hundred Four  
27 Dollars (**\$17,982,304**) is appropriated from the GMHA Pharmaceuticals Fund

1 to GMHA for Fiscal Year 2022. Notwithstanding §§ 26208.2 and 26208.3 of  
2 Article 2, Chapter 26, Title 11 GCA, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* is authorized to  
3 determine that one hundred percent (100%) of the appropriation in this  
4 Section can be expended for GMHA in FY 2022 as a direct subsidy; this  
5 determination shall be made via Executive Order, issued no later than  
6 September 1, 2022.”

7 **Section 3.** A new Section 21 is hereby *added* to Chapter XI (Miscellaneous  
8 Appropriations) of Public Law 36-54 (the General Appropriations Act of 2022) to  
9 read as follows:

10 **“Section 21. *Prugrâman Ayuda Para I Taotao-ta Energy Credit***  
11 ***Program; Establishment and Appropriation.***

12 (a) There is hereby established the *Prugrâman Ayuda Para I*  
13 *Taotao-ta Energy Credit Program*. The purpose of the *Prugrâman Ayuda Para*  
14 *I Taotao-ta Energy Credit Program* is to provide each of the Guam Power  
15 Authority’s fifty-two thousand seven hundred sixty-two (52,762) residential,  
16 master-metered, and commercial customers with a Five Hundred Dollars  
17 (\$500) credit toward their account, to be disbursed One Hundred Dollars  
18 (\$100) each month for the months of July, August, September, October, and  
19 November 2022, and shall only be credited to the current billing of such  
20 months. The sum of Twenty-six Million Three Hundred Eight-one Thousand  
21 Dollars (**\$26,381,000**) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the  
22 Guam Power Authority, and shall be disbursed to the Guam Power Authority  
23 in five (5) equal monthly installments for the purposes of this Section. The  
24 Guam Power Authority shall reflect the One Hundred Dollars (\$100) energy  
25 credit on each customer’s billing statement pursuant to this Section. The  
26 Department of Administration shall equally disburse this appropriation to the

1 Guam Power Authority for each of the five (5) months of July, August,  
2 September, October, and November 2022.

3 (1) Validation of Master-Metered Accounts. The Guam  
4 Power Authority shall, from all Master-Metered Accountholders,  
5 obtain a notarized list of the number of active residential utility power  
6 sub-accounts under that Master Meter to ensure the proper application  
7 of the credit to the Master-Metered Account.

8 (b) Credits received from the *Prugrâman Ayuda Para I Taotao-ta*  
9 Energy Credit Program shall be tax-exempt.

10 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation,  
11 the amount authorized pursuant to this Section may be expended from funds  
12 that may be available from the following:

13 (1) Fiscal Year 2021 excess General Fund revenues; and

14 (2) Fiscal Year 2022 General Fund appropriation as  
15 authorized by this Act; and

16 (3) Any federal appropriations that can be used for the  
17 purposes of this Act.

18 No local funds may be used for the *Prugrâman Ayuda Para I Taotao-*  
19 *ta* Energy Credit Program as long as federal funds that can be used for the  
20 purposes of this Act are available to encumber, obligate, or expend.”

21 **Section 4.** Section 4(a) of Chapter I (General Provisions) of Public Law 36-  
22 54 (the General Appropriations Act of 2022) is *amended* to read:

23 “**Section 4. Suspension of Two Percent (2%) General Fund**  
24 **Reserve (Deficit Reduction/ Rainy Day Fund).**

25 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation,  
26 the requirement to deposit two percent (2%) of General Fund revenues into

1 the Rainy Day Fund pursuant to § 22436, Chapter 22, Title 5 GCA, is hereby  
2 suspended for Fiscal Year 2022.

3 Nothing herein shall prevent *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* from making such  
4 deposits into the Rainy Day Fund as deemed necessary. Notwithstanding any  
5 other provision of law, rule, or regulation, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* shall deposit  
6 Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000) into the Rainy Day Fund from FY 2022  
7 General Fund revenues which shall be reserved for additional pandemic relief  
8 and recovery programs as authorized by *I Liheslatura*. General Fund revenues  
9 collected in excess of the adopted revenues as the basis for the appropriations  
10 contained in Public Law 35-99 and this Act shall be deposited as follows:  
11 seventy percent (70%) of such excess revenue shall be deposited into the  
12 Income Tax Refund Efficient Payment Trust Fund of Chapter 51 of Title 11  
13 GCA, and thirty percent (30%) of such excess revenue shall be deposited into  
14 the Rainy Day Fund; provided, that all excess revenue referenced herein shall  
15 be subject to legislative appropriation.”

16 **Section 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any  
17 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall  
18 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without  
19 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are  
20 severable.

21 **Section 6. Effective Date.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
