BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SAIS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Major General Tracy L. (Artero) Smith was born on March 15, 1966 at the Guam Memorial Hospital; and she is married to United States Army First Sergeant Scott Smith (Ret.). She is a graduate of the Class of 1983 of Guam Adventist Academy and the Class of 1987 of the University of Guam (UOG) where she earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. She was also in the UOG Army Reserve Officer Training Corps where she was awarded with a four (4)-year merit scholarship, as well as a two (2)-year ROTC scholarship where she was later commissioned as a Second Lieutenant; and

WHEREAS, Major General Tracy (Artero) Smith then went on to earn a Master of Business Administration degree from Troy University in Alabama in 2002 and a Master of Strategic Studies from the Army War College in Pennsylvania in 2007. In addition to the U.S. Army Medical Department (AMEDD) Basic and Advanced Courses, her military education includes the Army Personnel Officer's Course, the Army Force Management Course, the Combined Arms Services Staff School, the Command and General Staff College, the Army Management Staff College's Sustaining Base Leadership Management Program, and the Army War College; and

WHEREAS, through her training, Major General (Artero) Smith has had an extensive operations and personnel background which led her to serve in numerous leadership and staff positions such as: Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations, Mobilization, Training and Readiness (G-3/5/7/Readiness), Army Reserve Medical Command (AR-MEDCOM), Deputy Chief of Staff for Force Development and Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel (Deputy G-1) AR-MEDCOM; Area Coordinator, Federal Coordinating Center, National Disaster Medical System, Madigan Army Medical Center, Tacoma, Washington; Force Integration Officer, Western Region Medical Command, Fort Lewis, Washington; Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel (Deputy G-1), Medical Operations Officer, Secretary of the General Staff and Adjutant, 3rd Medical Command, Atlanta, Georgia; Operations Officer (S-3), Assistant Operations (S-3)/Training Officer and Personnel Officer (S-1), 1984th U.S. Army Hospital, Honolulu, Hawaii; Aide-de-Camp and Company Commander, Tripler Army Medical Center, Honolulu, Hawaii; Chief, Officer Management, 9th Infantry Division Headquarters; Medical Operations Officer, 9th Infantry Division Surgeon's Office; Executive Officer, A Company, 709th Main Support Battalion, 9th Infantry Division; Executive Officer and Ambulance Platoon Leader, A Company, 99th Forward Support Battalion, 9th Infantry Division, Fort Lewis, Washington; and

WHEREAS, Major General Tracy (Artero) Smith's most recent assignments were serving as the Commanding General, 18th Medical Command (Deployment Support) and the Deputy Commanding General for Support, 807th Medical Command (Deployment Support). Major General (Artero) Smith also served as the Chief of Staff, Army Reserve Medical Command, Pinellas Park, Florida, as well as being the first Active Guard and Reserve (AGR) Commander of the 865th Combat Support Hospital, Utica, New York; and

WHEREAS, Major General Tracy (Artero) Smith's awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit (Oak Leaf Cluster), the Bronze Star Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal (five Oak Leaf Clusters), the Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Humanitarian Service Medal, the Joint Meritorious Unit Award, the German Armed Forces Military Proficiency Badge, and the Expert Field Medical Badge; and


WHEREAS, Major General (Artero) Smith assisted in humanitarian operations and service campaigns such as the Montana Forest Fires, COVID Response, Operation Enduring Freedom, and Operation Iraqi Freedom. She also led her units for Operation Bright Star, Egypt and Task Force Kout Men, Haiti and has been awarded the 9A Medical Proficiency Designator and the Order of Military Medical Merit; and on January 24, 2016, Major General (Artero) Smith received her first star; and


WHEREAS, Major General (Artero) Smith currently serves as the Deputy Surgeon General for Readiness, Mobilization and Reserve Affairs, Office of The Surgeon General, U.S. Army. She has since been promoted to her current rank of Major General with a ceremony held in her honor on December 18, 2020, thus making her the first female from Guam to be promoted to the rank of General in the U.S. Armed Forces; now therefore, be it


