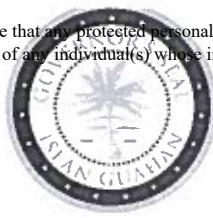

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NAVFAC Marianas: After artifacts collected, historic sites bulldozed

The military on Guam has confirmed historic sites found within infrastructure projects related to the relocation of Marines to the island have been leveled and more will be bulldozed to make way for facilities.

Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC) Marianas, which supports local activities of the U.S. military, clarified for The Guam Daily Post language included in two programmatic agreement memos issued for public comment, which said historic properties identified in areas affected by construction “will no longer be extant” once mitigation work was completed.

“Significant discoveries” that were identified through another, ongoing construction project in the area were data recovered, along with site information documented, according to the command. The development is taking place in a site the military calls North Finegayan, but the location has also been called Machanao pre-World War II, according to the memos.

“Recovered associated artifacts and any other resources that could be curated were collected and are properly stored pending turnover to the government of Guam upon the completion of the future cultural repository,” said JoAnna Delfin, public affairs officer for NAVFAC Marianas.

Several residents, community organizations and lawmakers have advocated for any historic or cultural discoveries found during military construction projects to be preserved in place or for any artifacts or other archaeological findings not to be further disturbed. NAVFAC also confirmed the historic sites previously identified have already been developed.

“All recoverable features are no

longer in place as the site has been graded to bedrock,” Delfin said.

NAVFAC Marianas said once a discovery is made, its location is documented with “sub-meter accuracy.” Collection efforts can include hand excavation, screening soil, and collecting soil and carbon samples. This type of mitigation work leaves a historic property with its “integrity diminished” and characteristics “altered,” according to the memos.

But not everything discovered was collected before it was subsequently leveled.

“While curation is an important part of the process, not every piece of an artifact was collected if it was determined that a sample can provide the same type of information,” Delfin said. “Although traces of the site are removed, the information and location are documented in technical reports for future studies about the area and its environment, which contributes to the knowledge of Guam’s history and the CHamoru people.”

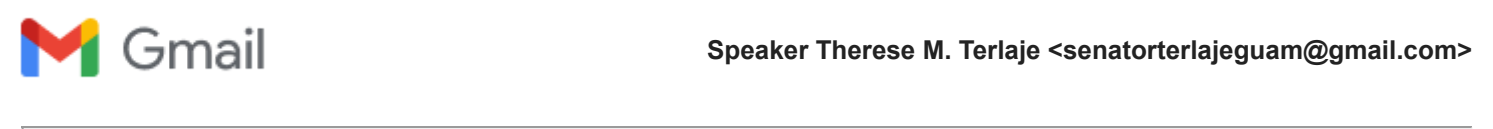

Taiwan staff leave HK amid 'one China' row

TAIPEI (Reuters) - Taiwanese staff working at the island's representative office in Hong Kong will begin leaving the Chinese-run city from Sunday, a senior official said, after the government there demanded its officials sign a document supporting Beijing's claim to Taiwan.

Chinese-ruled Hong Kong has become another bone of contention between Taipei and Beijing, especially after Taiwan lambasted a security law imposed on Hong Kong by Beijing and began welcoming Hong Kongers to settle on the island.

Lin Fei-fan, deputy secretary general of Taiwan's ruling Democratic Progressive Party, said only local staff would remain at the office.

"This is because the Chinese Communist Party and the Hong Kong government continue to force our personnel stationed in Hong Kong to sign a 'one China commitment letter' to recognize 'one China,'" he said on his Facebook page.

"As a political prerequisite for the visa renewal, we will of course not accept it!"

China sees democratically-ruled Taiwan as part of "one China" and has never renounced the use of force to bring the island under its control.

Lin said Taiwan would never accept "one China" or "one country, two systems", Beijing's way of running Hong Kong under Chinese sovereignty it hopes to one day apply to the island.

A senior Taiwan official familiar with the matter told Reuters seven Taiwan officials will return on Sunday afternoon, with the last remaining official to come back after visa expiry next month.

"It is not acceptable for us to be politically diminished," the official said, pointing to the request to sign the document.

In a statement earlier on Sunday, Taiwan's Mainland Affairs Council said that since July 2018 the Hong Kong government has "repeatedly set unreasonable political conditions for staff visas for our Hong Kong office, demanding the signing of a 'One China Commitment Letter'".

Starting from Monday, the Hong Kong office will "adjust its business handling method," it added, saying the office will maintain "necessary operations".

Taiwanese staff will not sign any such "one China" letter, it added.

Last month, Hong Kong suspended operations at its Taiwan representative office, blaming Taipei's "gross" interference in internal affairs, including with its offer to assist "violent" protesters, accusations Taiwan rejected.

Macau's government followed suit on Wednesday.

As Iran veers right, ties to Gulf Arab states hinge on nuke pact

DUBAI (Reuters) - Gulf Arab states are unlikely to be deterred from dialogue to improve ties with Iran after a hardline judge won the presidency but their talks with Tehran might become tougher, analysts said.

Prospects for better relations between Muslim Shi'ite Iran and Sunni Gulf Arab monarchies could ultimately hinge on progress to revive Tehran's 2015 nuclear accord with world powers, they said, after Ebrahim Raisi won Friday's election.

The Iranian judge and cleric, who is subject to U.S. sanctions, takes office in August, while nuclear talks in Vienna under outgoing President Hassan Rouhani, a more pragmatic cleric, are ongoing.

Saudi Arabia and Iran, longtime foes, began direct talks in April to contain tensions at the same time as global powers have been embroiled in nuclear negotiations.

"Iran has now sent a clear message that they are tilting to a more radical, more conservative position," said Abdulkhaleq Abdulla, a UAE political analyst, adding that Raisi's election might make improving Gulf ties a tougher challenge.

"Nevertheless, Iran is not in a position to become more radical ... because the region is becoming very difficult and very dangerous," he added.

The United Arab Emirates, whose commercial hub Dubai has been a trade gateway for Iran, and Oman, which has often played a regional mediation role, were swift to congratulate Raisi.

Saudi Arabia and Bahrain are the only Gulf states yet to comment.

"The faces may change but the leader is (Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali) Khamenei," columnist Khaled al-Suleiman wrote in Saudi newspaper Okaz.

Raisi, an implacable critic of the West and an ally of Khamenei, who holds ultimate power in Iran, has voiced support for continuing the nuclear negotiations.

"If the Vienna talks succeed and there is a better situation with America, then (with) hardliners in power, who are close to the supreme leader, the situation may improve," said Abdulaziz Sager, chairman of Gulf Research Center.

Håfa Adai Madam Speaker, Members of the Committee, and Senators:

It is my privilege and honor to appear before you this morning to testify on my appointment as a member to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC) by Governor Lou Leon Guerrero for the term April 1, 2019 – March 31, 2023.

One of the more notable accomplishments during my tenure as Attorney General was breathing life into the CICC. Since the passage of the Compensation for Damages from Criminal Activities law, the CICC suffered from a lack of administrative infrastructure that plagued many a well-intended commission. However, during my tenure as Attorney General, the CICC became fully operational and functioning in 2015 – with the adoption of rules & regulations, the establishment of an administrative unit with permanently assigned personnel, creation of a protected account or fund not subject to executive transfer, development of online access to application forms and explanatory materials, implementation of a notification process within the criminal justice system, expansion of federal funding entitlement for future compensation, and most importantly, the actual awarding of claims to eligible victims of crime. Within the first 6 months of my tenure, rules and regulations were adopted and the program was off the ground.

I am informed by the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) that since 2016, the Commission has received 189 applications, and out of that number, the Commission has awarded compensation to 95 applicants. The CICC Fund continues to be viable and healthy under the purview of the OAG. As a result of the CICC's ongoing awards, the Fund has received \$210,000 in supplemental incentive funding from the Office of Victims of Crime (OVC) Victim Compensation Formula Grant; quite simply, the more money awarded, the more money Guam will receive.

I look forward to working with the CICC once again, this time as a member. Along with *Pa'le* Mike Crisostomo, Dr. Lisa Flores and Ms. Denise Mendiola the CICC will remain an active body for the benefit of victims of crime. I especially want to commend Attorney General Leevin T. Camacho for continuing to support the work of the CICC despite the difficulties of the past year. I pledge my utmost efforts in service to the CICC and on behalf of victims of crime.

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§ 161.10. Definitions.

As used in this Chapter:

(a) ‘Child’ means an unmarried person who is under eighteen (18) years of age and includes a stepchild or an adopted child;

(b) ‘Commission’ means the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission established by this Chapter;

(c) ‘Dependents’ means relatives of a deceased or injured victim who were wholly or partially dependent upon the victim’s income at the time of the victim’s death or injury and includes the child of the victim born after the victim’s injury or death;

(d) ‘Injury’ means actual bodily harm and, in respect of a victim, includes pregnancy, and mental or nervous shock;

(e) ‘Person’ means a natural person;

(f) ‘Private citizen’ means any natural person other than a peace officer who is actively engaged in the performance of his or her duties;

(g) ‘Relative’ means a victim’s spouse, parent, grandparent, stepfather, stepmother, child, grandchild, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister or spouse’s parents; and

(h) ‘Victim’ means a person who is injured or killed by any act or omission of any other person coming within the description of any of the crimes specified in Section 161.55 of this Chapter.

§ 161.15. Creation of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission.

There is, within the government of Guam, a Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (Commission) which shall

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be comprised of five (5) members appointed by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* with the advice and consent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Annually, the members shall elect a chairperson of the Commission.

(a) In the absence of a quorum resulting from a vacancy, the Attorney General, or his Chief Deputy, are hereby granted the same powers and authority as the Commission under this Chapter to carry out the purposes and requirements of this Chapter.

§ 161.20. Tenure and Compensation of Members.

The term of office of each member of the Commission shall be four (4) years or until his successor is appointed, except that the terms of office of the members first taking office shall expire as designated by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* at the time of appointment as follows: one (1) at the end of one (1) year, one (1) at the end of two (2) years, one (1) at the end of three (3) years, and two (2) at the end of four (4) years. Any member appointed to fill the vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which his or her predecessor was appointed, shall be appointed for the remainder of the term. A vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its powers. If any member of the Commission is unable to act because of absence, illness or other sufficient cause, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* may make a temporary appointment, and such appointee shall have all the powers and duties of a regular member of the Commission for the period of their appointment.

§ 161.25. Powers and Procedures of Commission.

Upon an application made to the Commission under this Chapter, the Commission shall fix a time and place for a hearing on such application and shall cause notice thereof to be given to the applicant. The Commission may hold such hearings, sit and

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act at such times and places, and take such testimony as the Commission may deem advisable. Any three (3) members shall constitute a quorum. The concurring vote of three (3) members shall be necessary to take any action. Any member of the Commission may administer oaths or affirmations to witnesses appearing before the Commission. The Commission shall have such powers of subpoena and compulsion of attendance of witnesses and production of documents and of examination of witnesses as are conferred upon the Superior Court. Subpoena shall be issued under the signature of the Chairman. The Superior Court may, upon the application of the Commission, enforce the attendance and testimony of any witness and the production of any documents so subpoenaed. Subpoena and witness fees and mileage shall be the same as in criminal cases in the Superior Court, and shall be payable from funds appropriated for expenses of administration.

§ 161.30. Hearings and Evidence.

(a) Where any application is made to the Commission, the applicant and the Commission's legal advisor shall be entitled to appear and be heard. Any other person may appear and be heard who satisfied the Commission that he or she has a substantial interest in the proceedings. In any case in which the person entitled to make an application is a child, the application may be made on his or her behalf by his or her parent or legal guardian. In any case in which the person entitled to make an application is mentally defective, the application may be made on his or her behalf by his or her guardian or such other individual authorized to administer the estate.

(b) Where under this Chapter a person is entitled to appear and be heard by the Commission, that person may appear in person or by his or her attorney. All hearings shall be open to the public unless, in a particular case, the Commission determines that the hearing, or a portion thereto, should be held in private, having regard to the fact that the offender has not been convicted or to the interest of the victim of an alleged sexual offense.

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(c) Every person appearing under this Chapter shall have the right to produce evidence and to cross-examine witnesses. The Commission may receive as evidence any statement, document, information or matter that may, in the opinion of the Commission, contribute to its functions under this Chapter, whether or not such statement, document, information or matter would be admissible in a court of law.

(d) If any person has been convicted of any offense with respect to an act or omission on which a claim under this Chapter is based, proof of that conviction, unless an appeal against the conviction or a petition for a hearing in respect of the charge is pending or a new trial or rehearing has been ordered, shall be taken as conclusive evidence that the offense has been committed.

§ 161.35. Medical Examination.

The Commission may appoint an impartial licensed physician to examine any person making application under this Chapter, and the fees for the examination shall be paid from funds appropriated for expenses of administration.

§ 161.40. Attorney Fees.

(a) The Commission may, as part of any order entered under this Chapter, determine and allow reasonable attorney fees, which if the award of compensation is more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the award, to be paid out of but not in addition to the award, to the attorneys representing the applicant; provided, that the amount of the attorney fees shall not, in any event, exceed the award of compensation remaining after deducting that portion thereof for expenses actually incurred by the claimant.

(b) Any attorney who charges, demands, receives or collects for services rendered in connection with any proceedings under

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this Chapter any amount in excess of that allowed under this Section, if any compensation is paid, shall be fined not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00).

§ 161.45. Reconsideration by Commission; Judicial Review.

(a) The Commission may, on its own motion or on the application of any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the Commission, reconsider the order or decision and revoke, confirm and verify the order or decision, based upon the findings of the Commission.

(b) Any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the Commission on the sole ground that the order or decision was in excess of the Commission's authority or jurisdiction, shall have a right of appeal to the Superior Court; provided, that the appeal is filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after service of an original or a certified copy of such order or decision. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, orders and decisions of the Commission shall be conclusive and not subject to judicial review.

§ 161.50. Eligibility for Compensation.

(a) In the event any person is injured or killed by any act or omission of any other person coming within the criminal jurisdiction of Guam after September 30, 1980, which act or omission is within the description of the crimes enumerated in Section 161.55, the Commission may, in its discretion, upon an application, order the payment of compensation in accordance with this Chapter:

- (1) to or for the benefit of the victim;
- (2) to any person responsible for the maintenance of the victim, where that person has suffered pecuniary loss or

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incurred expenses as a result of the victim's injury or death;

(3) in the case of the death of the victim, to or for the benefit of any one (1) or more of the dependents of the deceased victim; or

(4) to a parent of an adult deceased victim, or to an adult son or daughter of a deceased victim, where the parent or adult son or daughter has incurred expenses on account of hospital, medical, funeral and burial expenses as a result of the victim's injury and death.

(b) For the purposes of this Chapter, a person shall be deemed to have intentionally committed an act or omission, notwithstanding that by reason of age, insanity, drunkenness or otherwise, he or she was legally incapable of forming a criminal intent.

(c) In determining whether to make an order under this Section, the Commission may consider any circumstances it determines to be relevant, and the Commission shall consider the behavior of the victim, and whether, because of provocation or otherwise, the victim bears any share of responsibility for the crime that caused his or her injury or death, and the Commission shall reduce the amount of compensation in accordance with its assessment of the degree of such responsibility attributable to the victim.

(d) An order may be made under this Section whether or not any person is prosecuted for or convicted of a crime arising out of an act or omission described in Subsection (a) of this Section; provided, that an arrest has been made or such act or omission has been reported to the police without undue delay. No order may be made under this Section unless the Commission finds that:

(1) the act or omission did occur; and

(2) the injury or death of the victim resulted from the act or omission.

(e) Upon application from either the Attorney General or the Chief of Police, the Commission may suspend proceedings

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under this Chapter for such period as it deems desirable on the ground that a prosecution for a crime arising out of the act or omission has been commenced or is imminent, or that release of the investigation report would be detrimental to the public interest.

(f) If a resident of Guam is a victim of a crime as defined in Section 161.55 of this Chapter, but the crime occurred outside the boundaries of Guam, the resident has the same rights under the provisions of this Chapter as if the crime had occurred within Guam upon a showing that the state, territory, country or political subdivision of a country in which the crime occurred does not have a crime victim's compensation law which covers the injury or death suffered by the resident.

§ 161.55. Violent Crimes.

(a) The crimes to which this Chapter applies are the following:

- (1) Aggravated Murder (9 GCA § 16.30);
- (2) Murder (9 GCA § 16.40);
- (3) Manslaughter (9 GCA § 16.50);
- (4) Aggravated Assault (9 GCA § 19.20);
- (5) Assault (9 GCA § 19.30);
- (6) Kidnapping (9 GCA § 22.20);
- (7) Felonious Restraints (9 GCA § 22.30);
- (8) Child Stealing (9 GCA § 22.40);
- (9) Custodial Interference (9 GCA § 22.50);
- (10) Criminal Sexual Conduct in the First Degree (9 GCA § 25.15);
- (11) Criminal Sexual Conduct in the Second Degree (9 GCA § 25.20);

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(12) Criminal Sexual Conduct in the Third Degree (9 GCA § 25.25);

(13) Criminal Sexual Conduct in the Fourth Degree (9 GCA § 25.30);

(14) Assault with Intent to Commit Criminal Sexual Conduct (9 GCA § 25.35);

(15) Driving While Impaired (9 GCA § 92102);

(16) Driving While Impaired With Child On Board: Felony Punishment (9 GCA § 92109), provided a child under the age of sixteen (16) was injured as a result of an accident in which the vehicle operated by the person charged with the above violation was involved;

(17) Vehicular Negligence: Bodily Injuries (9 GCA § 92108);

(26) Carjacking (9 GCA §§ 37.310, 37.320, and 37.330).

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(b) For the purpose of this Chapter, the operation of a motor vehicle, boat, or aircraft that results in an injury or death *shall not* constitute a crime, unless the injuries were intentionally inflicted through the use of such vehicle, boat, or aircraft or unless the conduct constitutes a violation of 9 GCA § 92101, et seq. (The Safe Streets Act).

(c) Any fine imposed pursuant to 9 GCA § 80.50 of for conviction of any crimes specified in Subsections (a)(1) through (14) and (20) through (26) of this Section *shall* be paid into the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund established by § 161.90 of this Chapter.

§ 161.60. Award of Compensation.

The Commission may order, only from available balances in the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund, the payment of compensation under this Chapter for:

- (a) expenses actually and reasonably incurred as a result of the injury or death of the victim;
- (b) loss to the victim of earning power as a result of total or partial incapacity;
- (c) pecuniary loss to the dependents of the deceased victim;
- (d) pain and suffering to the victim; and
- (e) any other pecuniary loss directly resulting from the injury or death of the victim which the Commission determines to be reasonable and proper.

§ 161.70. Recovery from Offender.

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Whenever any person is convicted of an offense that includes any crime enumerated in Section 161.55 of this Chapter and an order for the payment of compensation is or has been made under this Chapter for injury or death resulting from the act or omission constituting such offense, the Commission may institute a derivative action in the Superior Court against the person or against any person liable at law on his or her behalf, in the name of the victim or such of his or her dependents as have been awarded compensation under this Chapter, for such damages as may be recoverable at common law by the victim or such dependents without reference to the payment of compensation. The court shall have jurisdiction to hear, determine and render judgment in any such action. The time of the occurrence of the act or omission until conviction of the offense and, thereafter, as long as the offender is in confinement for conviction of the offense, shall not constitute any part of the time limited for the commencement of the action by the Commission under the applicable statute of limitations. Any recovery in the action shall belong to the government of Guam; provided, that the Commission shall amend its order of compensation to provide for the payment of any portion of the recovery in excess of the amount of compensation prescribed in the order to any of the persons entitled to receive compensation under Section 161.50 of this Chapter in such proportions and upon such terms as the Commission shall deem appropriate.

§ 161.71. Fines Imposed on Offenders.

The statutes of limitation for commencing such civil action shall be tolled while the offender is absent from Guam or incarcerated in any facility whatsoever.

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Any recovery from the offender, excluding costs and attorney fees, shall be deposited into the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund.

§ 161.75. Eligibility for Compensation.

In the event a private citizen incurs injury or property damage in preventing the commission of a crime within Guam, in apprehending a person who has committed a crime within Guam, or in materially assisting a peace officer who is engaged in the prevention or attempted prevention of such a crime or the apprehension or attempted apprehension of such a person, the Commission may, in its discretion, upon an application, order the payment of compensation in accordance with this Chapter:

(a) to or for the benefit of the private citizen; or

(b) to any person responsible for the maintenance of the private citizen, where that person has suffered pecuniary loss or incurred expenses as a result of the private citizen's injury.

(d) pecuniary loss to the private citizen directly resulting from damage to his or her property.

All such orders shall contain words clearly informing the claimant that all awards and orders for payments under this Chapter are subject to the making of an appropriation by *I Liheslatura* to pay the claim, except as otherwise provided in Section 161.95 of this Chapter.

The Attorney General shall be the certifying officer of the Fund, and all payments therefrom shall be paid by the Attorney General upon order of the Commission. These funds shall not be transferred or used without the written approval of the Attorney General of Guam.

(b) The Commission shall have the authority to seek and accept on behalf of, and in the name of, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund from any government or agency thereof, or any person, natural or legal, advisory services, grants-in-aid, gifts, donations or money and other property for the benefit of the Fund; provided, however, that any such grants-in-aid, gifts, donations or other assistance shall not involve any obligation on the part of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund.

(c) Where the Commission has made an award pursuant to this Chapter, the Commission shall make such payments from the Fund to or on behalf of the victim, or to or for the benefit of one (1) or more of the dependents of a deceased victim, or to or for the benefit of other persons who have suffered pecuniary loss or incurred expenses on account of hospital, medical, funeral and burial expenses as a result of the victim's injury or death. Payments made pursuant to this Section shall not exceed the total amount of the award.

(d) The Attorney General shall transmit semi-annually to *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* and to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a report of the Commission's activities under this Chapter, including the name of each applicant, a brief description of the facts in each case, and the amount, if any, of compensation awarded. Such reports shall be due no later than January 30 and June 30 of each year. The Attorney General shall transmit the report, together with a tabulation of the total amount of compensation awarded.

§ 161.100. Recovery From Collateral Source.

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CH. 161 COMPENSATION FOR DAMAGES FROM CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES

(a) In determining the amount of compensation to be awarded under this Chapter, the Commission shall deduct amounts or benefits received or to be received from any source, whether from the offender or from any person on behalf of the offender, or from public or private funds, and which amounts or benefits result from or are in any manner, directly or indirectly, attributable to the injury or death which gave rise to the award; provided, that no deduction shall be made for death benefits received or to be received under any insurance policy covering the life of a deceased victim.

(b) Where compensation is awarded under this Chapter and the person receiving the same also receives any sum required to be, and that has not been deducted under Subsection (a) of this Section, he or she shall refund to the government of Guam the lesser of the sum or the amount of the compensation paid to him or her under this Chapter.

(a) A person convicted of a crime shall not derive any profit from the sale of his or her recollections, thoughts, and feelings with regard to the offense committed by that person until the victim receives any restitution or compensation ordered for him or her against the defendant and expenses of incarceration are recovered as provided in Subsection (c) and until the escrow account created under Subsection (b) is terminated under Subsection (d).

(b) Upon the conviction of a defendant for a crime involving a victim, and after notice to any interested party, the Attorney General may petition the court in which the conviction occurred to order that defendant forfeit all or any part of proceeds received or to be received by the defendant, or the defendant's representatives or assignees, from contracts relating to the depiction of the crime or the defendant's recollections, thoughts, or feelings about the crime, in books, magazines, media entertainment, or live entertainment, as provided in this

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Section. The proceeds shall be held in escrow for a period of not more than five (5) years.

(c) During the existence of the escrow account, proceeds in the account shall be distributed in the following priority to satisfy the following:

(1) An order of restitution entered under Sections 24 and 25.

(2) Any civil judgment in favor of the victim against that defendant.

(d) The balance remaining in the escrow account at the end of the escrow period shall be paid to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund.

If you or a loved one is a victim of crime, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program can provide financial reimbursement for crime-related expenses to ease some of the financial burden you may face.

➤ **Who can apply?**

Victims, Dependents, Parents, Guardians or any other persons who have incurred expenses as a result of a Victim's injury or death.

➤ **How do I know if a Victim is eligible?**

- a. Victim died *or* was injured;
- b. Crime is at least one (1) of the crimes listed in 8 G.C.A. § 161.55;
- c. Crime occurred in Guam, or if crime did not occur in Guam, Victim is a resident of Guam and place where crime occurred does not have a criminal injuries compensation program;
- d. Arrest made or crime reported to police without undue delay;
- e. Application made within 18 months of Victim's injury or death;

[Disclaimer: applicants should not assume they qualify or do not qualify for compensation. The Criminal Injuries Compensation Program reviews each case to determine eligibility; and refers all eligible cases to the Commission for final review and possible award]

- a. Medical Expenses

- c. Loss of Wages
- d. Property damage incurred as a result of the crime or incident;

Guidelines for Applying for Crime Victim Compensation

An application must be completed and filled out for each victim. If the victim is a minor or incompetent adult, the person filling out the form for the victim must be an adult who is responsible for the victim's welfare. Please fill out this application as completely and accurately as possible. Claims will be thoroughly investigated and verified. Incomplete applications will be not processed.

You *may* qualify for financial assistance through Guam's Criminal Injuries Compensation Program if you satisfy the eligibility requirements as follows:

- a) You are filing this application within 18 months from date of injury, death or property damage;
- b) Arrest made *OR* crime reported to police without undue delay;
- c) The act or omission resulted in the death or injury to the victim;
- d) The crime occurred in Guam, *OR* if crime did not occur in Guam, Victim is a resident of Guam and place where crime occurred does not have a criminal injuries compensation program;
- e) The act or omission resulted from a violent crime enumerated in 8 G.C.A. § 161.55;

An initial review of eligibility will be conducted by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program and ultimate determination of award will be made by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission pursuant to Guam law. The application is available at the Office of the Attorney General, Victim Service Center or on our website at www.guamag.org.

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Health, Land, Justice and Culture convened a virtual public hearing on Wednesday, June 23, 2021, at 9:00 AM utilizing *I Liheslatura's* Virtual Meeting Platform. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson to serve as a Member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission, and whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointment packet forwarded to this Committee for public consideration on April 22, 2021.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The virtual public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:07 AM. The appointment of Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission, was the first item on the agenda.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: *Håfa Adai.* We have on our agenda the appointment to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission of Elizabeth Barrett Anderson for a term of length of four years from April 1st, 2019, to March 31st, 2023, and the appointment of Denise M. Mendiola for a term length of four years from April 1st, 2021, to March 31st, 2025. We will reconvene after this hearing at 10:30 to hear the appointment of Dr. Lisa D, Flores to serve on the same commission for a term length of four years, April 1st, 2020, to March 31st, 2024. I'd like to acknowledge the presence of my colleagues this morning, beginning with the Minority Leader Senator Chris Duenas thank you for being here Senator. Senator James Moylan and Senator Anthony Ada. *Si Yu'os ma'åse* colleagues. We are joined by our former Judge, former Attorney General of Guam, and former Senator, Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson. Thank you for being here and our other nominee, Denise Mendiola who is also here with us. I see we have members from the Attorney General's office here with us today as well.

The Criminal Injuries Compensation program can provide financial reimbursement to victims of crimes for crime related expenses to ease some of the financial burden that they face. Victims, dependents, parents, guardians, or any other person who has incurred expenses because of the victim's injury or death can apply. Expenses that may be covered include, medical expenses, funeral, and burial costs, loss of wages, property damage incurred as a result of the crime, and any qualifying costs incurred as a result of the crime. Eligibility includes victim died or was injured, the crime is at least one of the crimes listed under eight GCA section 1610.5, the crime occurred in Guam, the victim is a resident of Guam, and place where crime occurred does not have a Criminal Injuries Compensation program, the arrest was made or crime reported to police without undue delay that the application was made within 18 months of the victim's injury or death and the commissions determine eligibility on a case by case basis. Applicants should not assume they qualify or do not qualify. For more information on the Criminal Injuries Compensation program, please contact Administrator Pauline Untalan at 475-3324 extension 5030 or visit the website of the Guam ag.org.

We're going to begin with the appointment of Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, and we will hear testimony of those who signed up before we hear from the nominee herself. I'd like to recognize again the presence of Father Mike who is a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation commission. Thank you, father, *Pale'* Mike for being here. For those signed up to testify, we have Deputy AG Shannon Taitano, Assistant AG, Janice Camacho and *Pale'* Mike Crisostomo. We will begin with the Deputy AG Shannon Taitano, but I don't see her here. We will go to Deputy AG Nishihira.

Fred Nishihira, Deputy Attorney General: Madam Speaker, if I can defer first to Mike, as the Chairperson for CICC to give testimony first.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Wonderful. Thank you, *Pale'* Mike, Mr. Chair, please.

***Pale'* Mike Crisostomo, Chairperson, Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission:** Thank you Madam Speaker and to Honorable Senators. Thank you for the opportunity to speak and give testimony on a good friend and wonderful mentor to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. It was EBA, your Honor, sorry, we refer to you now as EBA. EBA was the catalyst to making the Criminal Injuries Compensation what it is today, the effectiveness of it. Certainly, there are a lot of things to work on especially in regard to the law. I think now she would be that component that we're lacking to be able to look at some of the things that we can improve now that the commission has been very active in ensuring that compensation has been given to the victims. We try to meet quarterly with maybe as many as 20 cases per session. These commission members are very devoted and dedicated with EBA when she was the Attorney General. She made sure that we had the support of our office and the support that we needed to be able to ensure that the compensation commission was up and running, moving forward. She would be a great asset if she can be confirmed. With the three members I have been on board, Dr. Lisa, Denise, and I have been the three-member commission *antigu* times. We now would like to add more members into the commission to be able to see how it can flourish even better and knowing that there are things that we can learn from her as well, especially with regards to court proceedings and legal matters. I think this is where she'll be the expert coming in, granted that the Office of the Attorney General and his staff with the assistance of Janice and Fred. They've been very helpful and the staff that's been there with Pauline and others who will continue to help us as far as the program is concerned. We're very grateful for many of their efforts and helping us there, but please quickly and confidently

that we can proceed with confirming our Honorable Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson as a member of the commission. Thank you.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you *Pale'* Mike, Chairperson of the commission and thank you for your service on this commission. I am very impressed with the activeness of this commission, especially in comparison to years ago. Now we will hear from Deputy AG Fred Nishihira.

Fred Nishihira, Deputy Attorney General: Thank you Madam Speaker Senators. I will be reading from the Attorney General of Guam an official statement from our office, and then I'll just speak shortly as well on both of the recommendations for swift confirmation like *Pale'* Mike just said.

"Håfa Adai Madam Speaker as Attorney General of Guam. I submit testimony in support of the Honorable Barrett-Anderson appointment to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC).

The Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson has always been a staunch advocate of ensuring access to victim services, and thus, she would bring a great deal of experience, innovation, and compassion to the CICC. Her distinguished career in public service spans many decades and makes her uniquely qualified. In that time, she participated in criminal justice reform, inclusive of notable victim services reform, such as follows: establishing victim advocate services during her first term as Attorney General of Guam, developing the pro se order of protection process for victims during her time as judge of the Superior Court of Guam, and building a carefully considered CICC administrative infrastructure while also securing federal funding for the CICC during her second term as Attorney General.

The Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson deeply understands that victim compensation is one of the pillars of victim assistance because for most victims and their families, victim compensation is an exclusive resource. She also understands that victim recovery comes with its challenges, and that when victims face financial burdens in the aftermath of victimization, recovery is all the more out of reach.

Based on the Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson's distinguished record, I wholeheartedly support her appointment to the CICC. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me personally.

From the personal side, I have worked with the Honorable Barrett-Anderson in all three branches of government. I've worked with her as a Senator. I shouldn't say work, but I practiced under her as a Superior Court Judge. I want to say both times as an Attorney General, but the first time I applied at the AG's office, she actually decided not to hire me. To her credit, she did place me at DOE, which proved to be a much more valuable experience because it gave me a much broader picture of how the Government of Guam works.

Let me tell you about my experience with her. She has been like, I don't know the *CHamoru* name, but you know how you have an outside kitchen, and, in the morning, you talk with friends, you drink coffee and you discuss the problems of the world and how you fix it. Working with her has been very much like that, where we discuss problems and then you come up with these solutions, except unlike that where everybody leaves, and they go their respective way. She's your boss, she tells you, okay now get this done so she very much is a pusher to get things accomplished. Let me just highlight a few in the different government branches that I've worked with her, and she's been able to accomplish because of her will to get it done. Let's put it that way. While working with her as a Judge, I've been before her many times, and sometimes I win. Sometimes I've lost, but either way, her decisions have always been fair. Of course, it's always more fair when I win. While she was a judge, she pushed for criminal reform and personally headed up meetings to establish the School Resource Officer program, and we worked and worked, and she was able to fund that program through federal funds. It's a program that continues and I think it is a great program that continues in the school system today.

As a Senator, we worked on immediate issues, and we worked during that time there were these rolling blackouts, and she introduced a law that's still on the books today which is the streetlight program where basically, it affects businesses that are closest to streetlights, like for example, here at our intersection at ITC. FHP powers the streetlights, so if there is a power outage, the light system hooks up to the FHP generator. The other program that I particularly liked in her first term as a legislator was the It's the Law Program. That's where I got the example of you sitting around drinking coffee and you throw out, Hey, did you know that you are required by law to wear a helmet if you ride a bicycle, but not required by law to wear it if you ride a motorcycle? So those are the types of interesting things like, wow. Why is that? Who knows? But it's still law. You know what I mean? So those are interesting, amazing things that you get to learn there.

Finally, as the AG, you heard there's very numerous programs, but specifically with regard to the CICC program. Through her hard work and persistence here at the AG's office, she was able to secure federal funding, which matches at now 60 cents per dollar reimbursement. So, that really helps the fund. Some of the numbers that I can relate to you are thus far. I remember we've only had this fund; I believe three years now and we are now at \$210,000 for reimbursement. So, it's a pretty significant amount to victims of crime. Sometimes the victims of crime even before they go to trial, have a CICC check coming to them because they're a victim of crime, violent crime, and they are usually injured. They don't have any funds to pay for the hospital bills and so forth. They're getting collections notices and the CICC is able to get to them even before, or whether or not there's a guilty trial. What do you call that? The conviction? And then we go one step further. Of course, I'm working with *Pale' Mike*, and we make sure that if there is a conviction, we work with the court systems to reimburse that fund or restitution is ordered from the criminal to the CICC fund. So, the fund gets reimbursed through federal funds as well. If we pay the money upfront, the criminal reimburses that fund.

So, with that being said, she's very outside the kitchen, drinking coffee, get the work done. She will bring that to the CICC. I've been telling Janice here; we have to be careful what we ask for because once we bring Judge Anderson back on working with us the standard and the amount of work we have to do to her standard becomes much higher. We welcome that though because when the end of the day occurs, her focus is on making it right with victims, just like she wants to make it right with criminals. When she introduced the justice reform programs at the court and just like her previous time with getting resource officers to help the kids at DOE that we're going the right path. Now, what she is doing and making sure we take care of victims at the end of the day. So, with that Senators, Thank you for your time. I do recommend that you please do confirm. Thank you very much.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you very much Fred and to the Attorney General of Guam for your testimony and for the work on the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission as well and the support that the AG's office has given to it. I'll now recognize Assistant AG Janice Camacho. Thank you.

Janice Camacho, Assistant Attorney General: Thank you Madam Speaker. I'm actually attending this hearing as the Legal Counsel to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. However, I'd like to speak just real briefly in my personal capacity. Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson mentored me from the beginning. I've been a lawyer for a little less than 10 years and as a law clerk at the court, she was my mentor. She encouraged me to be fierce, be bold, be brave and to be a strong-minded woman. I just want to note that had

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it not been for her, the *pro se* order of protection program would not have been launched and it was only through the work that she did that we were able to set up online kiosk and forms, promulgate rules, and create an audio or a DVD that victims can access as a resource that they can refer to in filling out those forms. I just want to note that, and I also want to add that I followed her when she was elected Attorney General, for the second time I followed her to the AG's office and I'm still here. I'm proudly still here. I just want to say that she motivates, and she definitely is a staunch advocate of access to victim services, and I strongly am in support of her nomination.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you very much Attorney Camacho for that testimony. I'd like to recognize the presence of Senator Joanne Brown, who's also joined us this morning. Thank you, Senator. I think we've heard from everyone, so now I will open it up to the panel for questions.

I'm so sorry. We will now be going to hear from the nominee herself, Judge Barrett-Anderson. Lisa, you're welcome to give any testimony that you would like.

Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: My MIS daughter is missing. Can you hear me now? Okay, thank you. Thank you very much. I could say that I'll submit on my briefs, but, since I know this is a public hearing, allow me the few minutes and the very short few minutes to be able to read my testimony into the record.

Håfa Adai Madam Speaker and members of the committee and Senators. It is my privilege and honor to appear before you this morning to testify on my appointment as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (appointed by Governor Lou Leon Guerrero for the term April 1, 2019, to March 31, 2023).

One of the more notable accomplishments during my second tenure as Attorney General was breathing life into the CICC that was enacted in 1990 during my first term as Attorney General. Since the passage of the Compensation for Damages from Criminal Activities law, the CICC suffered from a lack of administrative infrastructure that plagued many well-intended commission members. However, during my tenure as Attorney General, the CICC became fully operational and functioning in 2015 with the adoption of rules and regulations, the establishment of an administrative unit with permanently assigned personnel, creation of a protected account or fund not subject to executive transfer, development of online access to application forms and explanatory materials, implementation of a notification process within the criminal justice system, expansion of federal funding entitlement for future compensation, and most importantly, the actual

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awarding of claims to eligible victims of crime. Within the first six month of my tenure, rules and regulations were adopted and the program was off and running.

I am informed by the Office of the Attorney General that since 2016, the Commission has received 189 applicants, and out of that number, the Commission has awarded compensation to 95 applicants. The CICC Fund continues to be a viable and healthy fund under the purview of the OAG. As a result of the CICC's ongoing awards, the fund has received \$210,000 in supplemental incentive funding from the Office of Victims of Crimes (OVC) Victim Compensation Formula Grant; quite simply Senators, the more money awarded, the more money Guam will receive from the federal government. I look forward to working with the CICC once again, this time as a member. Along with Pale' Mike Crisostomo, Dr. Lisa Flores, and Ms. Denise Mendiola the CICC will remain an active body for the benefit of victims of crime. I especially want to commend Attorney General Leevin T. Camacho for continuing to support the work of the CICC despite the difficulties of the past year. I pledge my utmost effort in service to the CICC and on behalf of victims of crime. Respectfully, Judge Barrett-Anderson.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you very much Judge Barret-Anderson. Again, I was the Oversight Chair of the Attorney General's office, and I think in your last term as Attorney General from 2017 to 2018, after I got elected. It was really a pleasure working with you and a very prominent part of what the Attorney General's office was doing was their work in this Criminal Injuries Compensation. There were many years prior to that, as you described, where it was not active at all, and victims had really no other recourse. So, this is huge, and I am excited at your service or willingness to serve on this commission and so that it will continue with its work and the work that it is doing. I'm going to ask just a couple of questions to put these on the record. Do you have any continuing business that may be a conflict of interest to do your duties on the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission?

Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: No.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Are there any current issues or obligations that may present a challenge to your ability to attend commission meetings?

Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: No, I think I can take care of my grandchildren and with zoom it's perfect. The most I have to do is chase them out of the room so, no.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: *Pale'* Mike, you said that you meet quarterly, and you handle at least 20 cases and at every meeting. How much time would you say you spend on your quarterly?

Pale' Mike Crisostomo, Chairperson, Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission: We average about the full two hours. We meet at three and then we end at about five o'clock. So, we do the full two hours, and we go through those cases very swiftly thanks to our administrative team that put together the caseload. They basically have everything prepared and we just go like clockwork, and it's wonderful having that kind of teamwork together. It makes it so possible for us to be able to get all of these individual applicants in there, so that we don't lose any of them because of paperwork or because of some kind of government bureaucracy or anything like that, but certainly we try to do due diligence to get all of those cases in, and we spend as much time as we need. Usually, it's about two hours from three to five.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Do you have an estimate of how swift is your response time to applications?

Pale' Mike Crisostomo, Chairperson, Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission: Depending on how well the application has been completed, the team puts together the commission. I would say turnaround time within a month or so, we will be reviewing applicants that have already applied within that month, or if not the three months span. If they complete all their documents and they turn in all their receipts or turn in whatever documents are required, we can have a turnaround time very, very soon. I would say as soon as that commission meets for that, it's already a decided moment. There are very rare moments where we would delay. If there's a delay in their application, it is only because information is lacking or because the individual needed more time to look for documents or information like that, but we try to do a good turnaround time.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you very much and thank you again for your service as Chairperson of this Commission for these years that it has been very successful, very responsive. Thank you to the Attorney General's office. And to Judge Anderson, thank you again for your service. I am looking forward to not just your continuation of what's going on there, but the improvements and a continuing pursuit of, as you did before, federal funds to help victims and other programs.

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So, I want to thank you again. I'm going to open it now to the Senators and beginning with Minority Leader, Senator Chris Duenas.

Senator Christopher M. Dueñas: *Si Yu'os ma'åse* Madam Chair, and your Honor Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson AOG. Thank you for accepting this excellent appointment by the Leon Guerrero Tenorio administration. Nineteen years ago, I began my journey into government service, and it started with meeting you as the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs. I wanted to share with the Committee that you also were the one who ushered in the juvenile drug court, and I just think that watching you over the years and the way that you treat everyone, no matter what their situation is and the way you treated clients was just something to behold. I just wanted to add to the things that I know of your character. I think our speaker has asked all the pertinent questions with regard to any issues. I don't have any questions, but I want to thank you for your willingness to serve once again. As you have a lifelong experience and service to the people of Guam and thank you for accepting this appointment and we look forward to great things. The CCIC obviously is getting a very esteemed member and someone who is going to continue the great work. So, that's all I have. Judge Anderson, I know you're going to do an excellent job and thank you once again. Thank you.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you, Senator. Senator Taitague, you are recognized.

Senator Telo T. Taitague: *Si Yu'os ma'åse* Madam Speaker for the opportunity. First, I'd like to thank *Pale'* Mike for his service for these many years and you being here today with your recommendation. Of course, we all know she's an amazing woman, just to be here for her and again for your service that you provided. I'd like to thank Fred too or at least the Attorney General for making sure that the website is up. I do have a question though Fred with regards to your website that you have on the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. There's a section in there that says the latest amendment to Public Law 34-034, which gives the Attorney General the authority to act on behalf of the commission in the event there is no quorum. How many members again are on this commission?

Fred Nishihira, Deputy Attorney General: There are three, currently three. So, Judge Barrett would be four.

Senator Telo T. Taitague: But there is no limit to how many sits on the commission?

Fred Nishihira, Deputy Attorney General: Janice is one, so she makes five.

Senator Telo T. Taitague: Okay. So, we just need one more to make a full commission in place. The bill that was passed and became Public Law, 34-034. Correct me if I'm wrong, but I opened that public law and it's totally different. It says the Veteran's License Law. So, if you can look into that to make sure that the Public Law 34-034 is correct, that's placed on your website. If you could just look at them. Maybe I'm wrong and maybe I'm looking at it wrong, I'm just plugging it in. I thank the Attorney General's office. I've mentioned many times before how well you're very transparent and how well you update your websites. It's been in every category that you oversee in the Attorney General's office. So, I thank you for that and if you could just look into that section.

Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: Senator, can I just comment on the five members. It's been five members since the creation of the commission. The fifth member under the general statute, that all boards and commissions must have a youth member, has restricted the governor from appointing to the fifth member of the commission because she has to find somebody under 25 years of age. And I'll be very honest with you, I don't know how *Pale'* Mike and Denise or Lisa feel about it or the other Senators. This is not a commission that really lends itself to somebody in the youth unless you've got the extreme maturity. There are probably pieces of amendments to the law that *Pale'* Mike would like, and the commission members would like to present to the Senators. I think to have a full commission of five would be wonderful, but having that youth restriction, I would recommend that it be eliminated.

Senator Telo T. Taitague: Thank you so much for that. That was my question to you as well with quorum. I appreciate that. I'll look into and work with the Oversight Chair to make that change or the amendment that's needed. Judge Anderson, I've known you for many years and I've had an opportunity to sit in your chambers and to listen to all the programs that you were doing at the courts. So amazing! It was inspirational. Your enthusiasm and just your drive to make Guam a better place to live was just so inspiring and I want to thank you for that. You've inspired many people, and I'm one of them that's on this Zoom chat that you have inspired and touched.

So, thank you. I greatly appreciate this on that level, but on a personal level, as an individual outside of work, morally, ethically with all good heart and good intention, God-fearing individual, you're an amazing person, personally. Your work stands for itself, but on another side, if people get to know you, you definitely have the compassion needed for this position. I just can't stop saying all kinds of nice things to say about you,

Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: I think you're talking about my mother Chung Barrett. I mean, everything you said represents my mother as well. So, I think I had a good mentor in my mom. She taught me very well.

Senator Telo T. Taitague: My kudos to your mom too. Other than Madam Chair, I thank you for the opportunity to say these words and I truly mean it. You're very inspiring. Good luck to you. Of course, you have my support and look forward to helping the commission to even go beyond what you do right now to make it a better place, because I do know that the more money, like you said, it's more money coming to Guam too, so we have to work on that as well. So, thank you again. Thanks Madam chair. Thank you, Elizabeth.

Senator Telo T. Taitague: Thank you Senator. Senator Anthony Ada, you're now recognized.

Senator V. Anthony Ada: Thank you Madam Speaker, Madam Chair. Good morning, your honor and thank you for accepting the nomination from Governor Leon Guerrero. I think she made an excellent choice for the commission in selecting you to be that member. I'm just glad that I never had to appear before you in your court or in any court for that matter. I think it's a truly, how do you say it? It's wonderful that you come out of retirement and are helping in other ways that you can. There's so much knowledge that you have. There's so much wisdom and inspiration that you carry along with you. I believe that the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission is something that needs people with compassion and needs people that understand and know what it is that victims go through. How is it that you need to be fair? I totally agree with you about the fifth member, not saying that we don't have youth that are able to come and step up to the plate in that fashion, but I think we need folks that have the experience and the knowledge and just everything required of being on this commission. This is one of those commissions that you do need that wisdom and knowledge, institutional knowledge as well. I'm glad that you accepted the Governor's invitation to be a member, and I look forward to working with you in any way possible on the commission. I look forward to voting for you and you have my full support, your honor. Thank you for being there and looking for ways that you can continue to help the community. You could have just stayed home and enjoyed the grandchildren, but I think that feeling in your heart or the feeling that you still have things to offer, and that's why you stepped up, and I'm so glad you did so. Thank you, your honor and you have my full support. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

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Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: I actually made a promise to *Pale'* Mike when my tenure was over. So, Attorney General, he said now you're coming on the commission. So, I'm probably a year too late. He would have preferred it that I went on a year earlier, but I wanted to enjoy the grands. So, this is also my commitment to *Pale'* Mike.

Senator V. Anthony Ada: Yeah, you don't want to break a commitment to *Pale'* because when you get up to see Peter, we want to make sure we go through the gates but thank you again your honor and congratulations.

Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: Thank you, thank you.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you Senator. Senator Moylan, you are recognized.

Senator James C. Moylan: Thank you Madam Chair. Thank you, your Honor. I appreciate you coming on back. It's interesting how you go full circle and now you're on this seat. It's nice how that worked out. You'll have a lot of information to share with the commission, and I'm glad you opened the door for us to assist you and amending the law and possibly creating that fifth seat, making it easier to fill and whatever other recommendations you have for that will be really helpful. I'm sure we'll all be open to hear your suggestions so we can strengthen the commission and do good for the people. Thank you for keeping your promise to Father Mike. I appreciate that and congratulations. Thank you, Madam Chair.

Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: Thank you Senator.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you Senator Moylan. Senator Brown, you are recognized.

Senator Joanne M. Brown: Thank you very much Madam Speaker. Certainly, all the various titles Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson has held over the years have been quite impressive. I'm sure her work and her contribution will be of value to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. I certainly wish her well and no doubt she will continue to contribute back to the community as she has all these many years. I think to have someone of her caliber along with the other commission members sitting, I'm sure we'll get favorable outcomes in the interest of all parties involved.

So, with that, thank you Madam Speaker for the opportunity to comment on Judge, Attorney General, former Senator, the list goes on, Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson's confirmation hearing this morning. Thank you.

Honorable Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, Nominee: Thank you, Senator. Thank you very much.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you very much Senator Brown. Thank you again Judge Barrett-Anderson for your willingness to serve on this commission, and I look forward to your contributions on the commission and recommendations for policy changes. There being no additional individuals to present testimony, this committee will consider the appointment of Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission duly heard. The time is 9:46 AM.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

- The Committee finds that Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, during her tenure as the Attorney General of Guam, played a key role in solidifying the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission to be a fully operational and sustainable Commission able to meet its intended goal of providing compensation to victims and their families. Barrett-Anderson has had a long history of victim's advocacy and hand in the improvement of victims' services throughout her past thirty-seven years of exemplary service to the people of Guam.
- The Committee further finds that Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson, as a former Attorney General from 1985-1987 and again from 2015 to 2018; former Senator in the 23rd and 24th Guam Legislature; Judge from 1998 to 2014, former legal counsel for the Guam Department of Education in 1981 to 1987, and former professor at the University of Guam from 2002 to 2014, is undoubtedly qualified to serve on the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission and will be a tremendous asset to the continued improvement of victims services on Guam.
