1/The proposed legislation intends to add a new Article 5, Chapter 50, Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to the creation of a Transshipment Taskforce which will be charged with developing a plan to implement a transshipment industry on Guam. The bill states that "it is the intent of I Lihesturan Guåhan to facilitate further economic diversification by creating a taskforce to review existing local and federal laws and coordinate land use and government resources to implement a transshipment industry". Per the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), the bill would not have any major impact to the Government of Guam at this time. However, GEDA notes that should the Taskforce explore economic opportunities and/or research projects there may be insufficient financial resources to accommodate these activities. GEDA does state that the "enactment of Bill 2-36 into law will require GEDA to commit additional personnel resources to ensure the proper participation of the Taskforce...". It was also stated that "...any and all support provided by GEDA in either staffing or other required needs are currently unbudgeted." Based on the aforementioned information provided by the GEDA and the Bureau's review, the legislation does not appear to have a negative impact to the Government of Guam at this time. However, the GEDA may need financial support in the future.
