1/: The proposed legislation intends to transfer the administrative jurisdiction of 5,509,664± square meters contained in Lot 507, consisting of the municipalities of Inarajan, Talofofo, Merizo, and Umatac to the Department of Agriculture (DOAg) for the purpose of developing the Guam Forest System Plan. The intent of the transfer is to plant native trees for soil enrichment and erosion control where flooding, wildfires, and other catastrophic events have caused long-lasting effects on natural resources, personal property, fish and marine life as part of the Guam Forestry Legacy Act of 2012. The proposed transfer of Lot 507 would mean the DOAg Forestry Division, and its available resources, will now be responsible for maintenance of the land. Absent feedback from the DOAg, the Bureau is unable to determine if the DOAg's current local and federal resources are sufficient to cover additional acres of conservation area or if they will need additional resources.
