1/ The proposed legislation intends to amend §§ 6224 and 6225 of Article 2, Chapter 6, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated relative to the administration of hazardous pay for Customs Officers and the adoption of a Table of Organization and Equipment (TOE) for the Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency (CQA). The legislation, if passed, would amend § 6224 to include Customs Officers assigned to a hazardous duty position to be entitled to hazardous duty pay. Currently the Customs Officers can only receive hazardous duty pay if they are directly identified as direct exposure personnel and only receive the additional pay upon exposure. It would also amend § 6225 which would now provide a definition of the term "hazardous" and "hazardous duty pays". It would also require the Director of Customs to establish, through a general order, the aforementioned TOE. Based on the current FY 2021 staffing pattern of CQA uniform personnel, the estimated cost impact would be approximately \$598,892 (Officers Base Salary - \$5,918,922 x 10%). The Bureau notes that although the hazardous duty pay is currently budgeted, CQA does not automatically pay out the hazardous duty pay unless the employees are directly exposed to a hazardous environment. Based on the latest Special Fund report the Customs, Agriculture and Quarantine Inspection Services Fund is projecting to collect \$1,064,791 less than the FY2021 adopted revenue level.
