BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. <u>188-36 (COR)</u>

The proposed legislation intends to *add* a new Article 16 to Chapter 22, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated – to be known as the "Opioid Prevention and Treatment Act." This act intends to establish an "<u>Opioid Recovery Trust Fund.</u>" where all opioid litigations entitled to Guam are deposited into such fund. This fund will be maintained by the Office of the Attorney General (OAG); separate and apart from any other funds and shall not lapse. This fund is not subject to transfer to the General Fund or through the Governor's transfer authority. Guam anticipates to receive up to \$10,000,000 from litigations between 2015 – 2019.

This act also establishes the "<u>Opioid Recovery Advisory Council</u> - which is a body of ten (10) members consisting of nine (9) voting members and one (1) non-voting chairperson. The voting members consists of Directors and Administrators of various Government of Guam entities and five (5) appointed members. The council is in charge of determining the expenditures of this fund through various programs or services to assist those recovering from opioid abuse (reasonable costs associated with the litigations).

Absent pertinent information from the OAG to include (a) the revenue credited to the fund; (b) administrative expenses; and (c) list of expenditures associated with treatment and recovery programs that may arise as a result of this measure, the Bureau cannot determine an approximate fiscal impact at this time. Although the proposed legislation poses no fiscal impact to the Government of Guam, the Bureau recognizes that this proposed legislation may have an impact on the revenues and expenditures the OAG, which is an autonomous agency pursuant to Chapter 14 of Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated.
