Bureau of Budget and Management Research Comments on Bill No. 205-36 (LS)

The proposed legislation intends to add a new Subsection (8) to § 15401(a) of Article 4, Chapter 15, Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to authorizing the Guam Ethics Commission to retain legal services. Per information provided by the Commission, it is recognized that legal services are necessary for it to hear complaints of potential violations regarding Guam statutes on ethics. The Commission's enabling statute provided two options for legal services; first would be to request the services of the Office of the Attorney General (OAG), the second would be to recruit a staff attorney for the Commission full-time. The first option would place the Commission and its counsel at a conflict of interest for cases related to the OAG. The second would require the Commission dedicate a large sum of its total annual appropriation towards the recruitment of a full-time attorney. The anticipated cost for a full-time attorney would range between \$70,000 to \$120,000 annually with fringe benefits.

The Bill provides that the Commission may retain legal services under terms and conditions determined by the Commission. The average market cost for private counsel is \$200 per hour. Should the Commission secure counsel at this rate for a minimum of ten (10) hours a month for twelve (12) months, the anticipated cost would be \$24,000 per fiscal year. This is a feasible amount per the Commission.
