The Bureau requests that Bill No. 101-36 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 101-36 (COR) is an act to add a new §26201(b) to Article 2, Chapter 26, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, relative to Business Privilege Taxes (BPT) being illustrated as a receipt line item. The Bill proposes that any person engaging in, transacting, conducting, continuing, doing, or carrying on a business in Guam, who is required to pay BPTs, shall show to each customer the amount that will be transmitted to the government of Guam as a receipt line item at the point of sale. As written, the legislation places this requirement solely on the business owner required to pay BPTs.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
