### Bureau of Budget and Management Research Comments on Bill No. 113-36 (COR)

The intent of Bill 113-36 is to add a new §61541(b)(4) and §61541(c)(4) to Subarticle 5 of Chapter 61, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated relative to the Establishing Guidelines for Off Premise Signs on Commercial and Industrial Zones.

Bill 113-36 will establish guidelines for off premise signs on commercial and industrial zones and that such off premise signs be approved by the Department of Public Works (DPW) pursuant to the requirements in the Chapter and that, any individual or company who violates the provisions of §61541(b)(4) and §61541(c)(4) also be subject to the penalties outlined pursuant to §61545 of the Chapter.

According to the comments received from DPW, the DPW supports Bill 113-36 to have such off premise signs on commercial and industrial zones be permitted, regulated, and have the same guidelines, permitting process and fees to include penalties imposed on sign regulations. DPW further states that inspection/permitting should be regulated as off-premise signs should not impede on highway visibility and night driving safety, and it should not cause an overload such as be inadequate for size, lighting, placement or combination of these factors. The DPW also notes that observing these guidelines is just as important with reference to commercial signs as it is for traffic safety signs.

The enactment of Bill 113-36 will pose a fiscal impact in terms of additional signage revenues generated in terms of civil penalties imposed by DPW for off premise sign violations occurring in both commercial and industrial zones. These signage revenues shall be deposited into the Public Signage Enforcement Fund created pursuant to §61545 of the Chapter. The Bureau is unable to provide any financial information on the Public Signage Enforcement Fund as it has yet to be established by DPW. As reflected on the Attachment to Bill No. 113-36 for revenue generating measures, the Bureau provides an estimated potential impact of the proposed measure should there be a total of 1, 3 or 5 violations and civil penalties imposed, and should late action civil penalties be added and recovered per month by DPW for either or a combination of both commercial or industrial zones.

Comments: Bill 113-36 provides that any individual or company who violates the provisions of §61541(b)(4) and §615419(c)(4) shall be subject to the penalties outlined pursuant to §61545 of the Chapter. §61545 imposes a civil penalty of \$1,000.00 for each violation occurring in commercial and industrial zones, and if not rectified within 10 business days of receipt of Notice of Violation from DPW shall be subject to a late action civil penalty not to exceed \$300.00 per day for each remaining violation. The revenues collected from the penalities recovered are to be deposited into the Public Signage Enforcement Fund created under §61545(b). The Bureau provides the following estimated potential revenues should there be a total of 1, 3, or 5 violations and civil penalties imposed, and late action civil penalties added and recovered per month by DPW for either or a combination of both commercial or industrial zones.
