Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. 127-36 (LS)

Bill No. 127-36 seeks to update the current laws on Guam relative to government bribery, other unlawful influence, official misconduct, and related offenses by amending Chapter 49 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated (GCA). The amendments consist of the inclusion of monetary fines as additional penalties to those found guilty of the following crimes listed below as defined in Chapter 49:

| 49.60 | Giving Gratuities for Past Services | Misdemeanor | Not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$10,000 |
| 49.70 | Accepting Gratuities for Past Services | Misdemeanor | Not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$10,000 |
| 49.80 | Use of Information for Private Gain | 3rd degree felony | Not less than \$10,000 nor more than \$50,000 |
| 49.90 | Official Misconduct | 3rd degree felony | Not less than \$10,000 nor more than \$50,000 |

The Bill further adds the following new sections to Chapter 49:

Should Bill No. 127-36 become enacted, the fiscal impact may result in the potential increase in fines collected for crimes of a similar nature. However, absent additional information specific to the number of successful convictions of these types of crimes, a more detailed fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time. Furthermore, the effect of the passage of the Bill to the Office of the Attorney General may be dependent on the extent to which the proposed legislation translates into increased caseloads and responsibilities (i.e., reviewing violations, charging of individuals, and prosecution). Additional personnel may be required to take on the added caseloads, however, due to the unknown variable regarding the number of new cases that may arise, the Bureau is unable to determine the amount of personnel needed to handle such caseloads.
