Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. 136-36 (COR)

The intent of Bill No. 136-36 is to amend the current laws relative to the appropriate disposition and preservation of court records governed by court rules and policies promulgated by the Supreme Court of Guam.

The Bill amends part (a) of §7120, Chapter 7, Title 7, Guam Code Annotated (GCA) by replacing the "computerized" form with the "digitized" form of any record (paper or document in the care of the Superior Court and of the Supreme Court) as an accurate reproduction of the original document in all material details. The legislation further amends part (d) by replacing the Judicial Council with the Supreme Court of Guam to promulgate rules to effectuate this section relative to the copying and disposition of court records. In addition, the Bill deletes part (e) in its entirety, effectively removing the requirement of maintaining a parallel microfilm or photographic storage of computerized records and papers not originally kept in computerized form.

Based on comments received from the Judiciary of Guam, Bill No. 136-36 will provide a cost saving measure for the Judiciary. This may be in part due to the proposed removal of maintaining microfilm or photographic storage of computerized records. However, absent additional information specific to the potential cost saving measures as commented by the Judiciary, the Bureau is unable to determine an approximate fiscal impact at this time.
