

Bureau of Budget and Management Research Comments on Bill No. 140-36 (LS)

The proposed legislation intends to create the Guam Humanitarian Service Award Program within the Office of the Governor of Guam for the awarding of individuals who actively participated in the accomplishment of missions or tasks to protect life and/or property during or in the aftermath of a natural or man-made disaster, public health emergency, or civil unrest. Per information provided by the Office of the Governor, the cost estimate for each certificate of award is Five Dollars (\$5.00), each ribbon for military or Government of Guam uniformed personnel awardees is Ten Dollars (\$10.00), and each lapel pin for non-uniformed Government of Guam personnel and non-Government of Guam civilian awardees is Two Dollars (\$2.00). Assuming there are an estimated fifty (50) awardees per award category each fiscal year, the estimated cost impact will total One Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,850.00), which is broken down by award category in the chart illustrated below.
