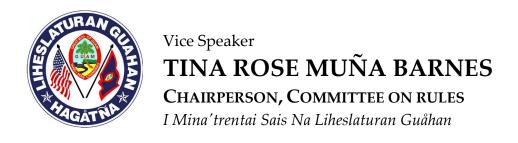

1/: In its current form, the intent of the subject legislation is to implement automatic voter registration in public high schools, the Guam Community College and the University of Guam. Additionally, private high schools are being given the option to be designated as places of registration of electors. There are a couple provisions in the legislation that may have a fiscal impact including the requirement for the aforementioned entities to print and have available voter registration forms or to make such forms be available electronically by utilizing certain equipment. However, the Bureau is unable to determine the overall fiscal impact of the subject legislation absent additional information from the Guam Election Commission.
