Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. <u>160-36 (LS)</u>

Bill No. 160-36 proposes to repeal and reenact Article 3 of Chapter 3, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated relative to adding minimum qualifications and changes to the Guam Historic Preservation Officer (GHPO) position citing this act as the "Empowering GHPO Act of 2021."

The minimum qualifications and changes added to the GHPO position in the Bill include the following per section:

§ 77302 – The GHPO shall be appointed by *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*, with the advice and consent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, of which the holder of the position shall be the State Historic Preservation Officer for federal purposes.

§ 77303 – The GHPO shall have at minimum a bachelor's degree in the field of history or a closely related field, including but not limited to CHamoru Studies and Anthropology and possess one of the following: (a) at least two years of full-time experience in research, writing, teaching, interpretation, or professional activity; or (b) substantial contribution through research and publication in the field of history.

§ 77303.1 – The GHPO shall not be serving concurrently in any federal employment position, to include active, reserve, and guard enlistment/service in the Armed Services or have served in any active, reserve, or guard capacity in the Armed Services within two (2) years prior to appointment.

§ 77303.2 – In the event of a vacancy, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* may appoint an Acting GHPO who shall meet the same minimum qualifications for a period no more than ninety (90) days from the date of the acting appointment.

As stated in the Bill, as well as in the existing law, the Civil Service Commission (CSC) shall establish the necessary qualifications and wage standards of the GHPO. The Government of Guam Competitive Wage Act of 2014 currently lists the Pay Grade and Step for an entry level GHPO at Q-1, \$60,482 Per Annum. The new minimum qualifications and changes proposed by the Bill may require the CSC to reevaluate the entry level pay for the GHPO position. As such, the Guam Historic Resources Division, under the Department of Parks and Recreation, may have to revise their current and future fiscal year budgets to accommodate the recruitment and hiring of a qualified GHPO meeting all the new requirements. However, absent specific information as to whether the minimum annual salary of the GHPO will be revised and to what extent, a more accurate fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time.
