1/: In its current form, the intent of the subject legislation is to address and modernize election-related issues inclusive of write-in votes, counting provisional ballots, electioneering at polling places, the cancellation of the primary election in certain circumstances and vacancies. If the Bill were to become law, should a primary elections not take place for certain contests, there would be a potential decrease in personnel cost, particularly in overtime. It should be noted that overtime cost incurred by the GEC averages approximately \$100K per year between FY2017 to FY2021 Year-To-Date. The GEC has indicated that should the Primary Election be cancelled in totality, the potential cost savings would be approximately \$365K.
