### Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. <u>191-36 (COR)</u>

Bill No. 191-36 amends § 3402 of Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 1, Title 9 of the Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations (G.A.R.R.) to allow Guam deer to be taken from the wild for the purpose of harboring them in captivity as livestock, as opposed to pets under the current rules, to allow more people access to deer as livestock and a food source. Although current Guam law makes it legal to raise deer calves as livestock, Guam law also makes it illegal for calves to be removed from the jungle.

With the intent of the legislation to clear up this ambiguity of the law, the amendments to the G.A.R.R. as proposed are administrative in nature. Furthermore, based on data obtained from the 2017 Census of Agriculture Guam (2018) Island Data Report as prepared by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, deer is not specifically quantified as livestock. Absent additional information specific to raising deer as livestock on Guam, the fiscal impact of this legislation cannot be determined at this time.
