BILL NO.185-36 (COR) IS AN ACT TO TRANSFER LOT NO. 10122-14NEW-R1, MUNICIPALITY OF DEDEDO, FORMERLY KNOWN AS THE DEDEDO SOLID WASTE TRANSFER STATION TO THE GUAM ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR THEIR HEADQUARTERS.
