The Bureau requests that Bill No. 272-36(COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 272-36(COR) is an act to amend Chapter 25, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, relative to increasing the minimum sentence of First-Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct (CSC) and establishing minimum sentences for Second, Third, and Fourth Degree Criminal Sexual Conduct. The proposed legislation is seeking to amend the minimum sentence for 1st-degree criminal sexual conduct from 15 years to 25 years. The Bill further amends the statute for sex offenders by establishing a minimum sentence of 25 years for 2nd-degree criminal sexual conduct, 25 years for 3rd-degree criminal sexual conduct, and 15 years for 4th-degree criminal sexual conduct, before they are eligible for parole.

The proposed amendments are administrative in nature and would not fiscally impact the appropriations for FY 2022.
