Hafa Adai Vice Speaker Barnes:

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 275-36 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill 275-36 (COR) is an Act to repeal and reenact §22421 of Chapter 22, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to recognizing public service contributions made by Autonomous Agencies of the Government of Guam.

The proposed legislation seeks to close the Autonomous Agency Collections Fund (AACF) and to deposit any amounts remaining in the AACF to be deposited into the General Fund, subject to appropriation by the Guam Legislature. Per OPA Report No. 22-01, the balance of the AACF has been Zero Dollars (\$0) since FY 2010.

Further, the proposed legislation will require the Port Authority of Guam, Guam Power Authority, Guam Waterworks Authority, and Guam International Airport Authority to report their prior fiscal year public service contributions no later than December 31st annually.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
