Hafa adai, Vice Speaker Muña Barnes:

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 352-36(COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 352-36 (COR): An act to *amend* §60112 of Chapter 60, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, relative to requiring prior approval from the legislature before purchasing or entering into a lease, license, or sub-lease of property owned by the federal government.

The proposed legislation intends to add language for all Government of Guam agencies, to include autonomous and semi-autonomous agencies, which will not allow them to acquire land held by the federal government without prior approval from the Legislature. The Legislature will need to duly enact legislation that specifically authorizes a particular sale, lease, license, or sub-lease of the federal property.

As such, the proposed legislation is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact on the Government of Guam.
