

BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 365-36 (LS)

The proposed legislation adds a new Section 54 to Chapter XII of Public Law 36-107 which will provide Special Pay for Public Defenders. The Section 54 will add a new §11111.1 to Chapter 11, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated. The intent is to achieve parity for attorneys serving as criminal defense attorneys at the Public Defender Service Corporation (PDSC) and the Alternate Public Defender (APD) to be entitled to special pay, calculated at the rate of their regular wage plus 15%.

Enacted on September 12, 2022, Public Law 36-107 ("FY 2023 General Appropriations Act") in part appropriates funding for the implementation of pay raises to help the PDSC and the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) improve recruitment and retentions of qualified criminal attorneys. However, whereas the FY 2023 General Appropriations Act provided the public defenders 6% salary increase, the budgeted bill was further amended on the floor to give prosecutors a 15% differential pay upon enactment. The subsequent result of this legislation is the pay disparity between the prosecutors and the public defenders for comparable work and impacts the PDSC's and APD's ability to hire and retain attorneys willing to represent those charged with criminal offenses.

According to the PDSC, there will be increased personnel services costs. The estimated additional amount required for PDSC is \$297,335 and for APD is \$112,640 for a total a \$409,974 for FY2023. The proposed legislation does not include an appropriation to cover the additional personnel services costs but provides authorization to be paid from FY2023 appropriations and other funds available from prior years. The PDSC also notes that additional funding will be required in subsequent fiscal years to continue the additional pay requirement beyond FY2023.
