BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 269-36 (COR)

The proposed legislation intends to amend §89.13(a) and §89.13(b) of Chapter 89, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, which mandates electronic monitoring of sex offenders on probation or parole. The amendment will alter the bill's existing language by changing the word "may" to "shall" and warrants the offender to buy/lease such electronic monitoring device. The bill also removes any language in these sections that state "any portion of or..." in relation to the duration of the probation/parole of the client.

Although this bill seems administrative in nature, correspondence with the Judiciary of Guam indicates that a significant fiscal impact may be felt on operations. The daily rate for self-monitoring is \$8.00 per client. Since the piloting of the EM program for pretrial release, there have not been any defendants placed on self-pay status. The Judiciary further states that the EM program currently has 16 defendants, however, only 10 are currently on the program. In addition to those in the EM program, there are 82 additional active pre-trial release cases for Criminal Sexual Conduct (CSC) and 22 cases serving a term of probation for CSC. Based on the information provided, the Judiciary estimates minimum fiscal impact of 100 clients at \$756,395 - \$334,642 for Salaries, \$122,253 for Benefits, and \$299,500 for Operational Costs. Cost includes probation personnel that provide monitoring services and assessments to all applicants in the program. Personnel includes one Probation Officer Supervisor and one Senior Probation Officer that allocate 50% of their work hours towards the program. Cost also includes estimates for three Probation Officer 1 and one Probation Services Assistant that are assigned to the program full time. Benefits include retirement contributions of 28.32%, Medicare tax of 1.45%, life insurance at \$183, Death & Disability Insurance at \$494, and FY 2022 medical and dental subscriptions plan for each of the respective employees in the program. Lastly, estimates herein also include compensation for overtime/compensation time earned, hazardous pay, and night differential pay.
