## Notes:

Upon the passage of Bill No. 268-36 (COR), any individual who is guilty of the provisions detailed in §5107 to Chapter 5, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and if convicted, shall pay a fine of up to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000), and shall be required to perform a minimum of one hundred eighty (180) hours but not to exceed three hundred sixty (360) hours of community service. Although the Civil Service Commission has no comment on the bill, the Bureau estimates revenues generated may be nominal as it would be a deterrence and would be contingent on the fine amount, not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000), per convicted violator.
