

## Bureau of Budget and Management Research Comments on Bill No. 289-36 (LS)

The proposed legislation intends to add a new § 73157 to Article 1 of Chapter 73, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, which would allow the Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency (CQA) reorganizational authority in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law for the purpose of providing assistance to better safeguard our island's ports of entry, and shall be known as the "Customs Reorganization Act of 2022".

The provisions of the Bill mandate the CQA to develop a budget for the reorganization to be submitted to I Maga 'hågan Guåhan and I Liheslaturan Guåhan for consideration, and to consider pursuing federal grants that may be available to support the reorganization of the agency. The legislation specifies as part of the Agency's reorganization the authorization for the creation and establishment of a Biosecurity Division, Management Information Systems Section, and Maritime Contraband Enforcement Team Section. The director of the CQA or their designee will be responsible for the development of a set of written guidelines to control the expenditure of the developed budget, and a report detailing the expenditures shall be submitted to the Bureau of Budget and Management Research for audit and approval.

The Agency must submit an action plan together with the required budget, no later than six (6) months following the enactment of this Act, that must include, but not be limited to, a project schedule, staffing pattern, and the identification of funding options, if any. It should be noted that there is no reorganization budget included in the CQA's FY 2023 certified budget request that was transmitted to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

While the proposed legislation will likely have a fiscal impact on the General Fund and/or the Agency's Special Funds, the Bureau is unable to determine the overall impact absent information from the CQA. The Agency will presumably be submitting a supplemental budget request in the first or second quarter of FY 2023.
