Bureau of Budget & Management Research Comments on Bill No. 284-36 (LS)

Bill No. 284-36 is an act to amend Article 3 of Chapter 51, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated (G.C.A.), and amend Article 3 of Chapter 24, Division 4, Title 22, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations (G.A.R.R.), relative to promoting Recycling and Zero Waste Initiatives. This Bill expands upon principles of traditional recycling by focusing on overall waste reduction, and promotes the research of innovative solutions to help address the rapidly decreasing life of our landfill.

The Bill proposes to amend various sections of Article 3, Recycling Revolving Fund of Chapter 51, Title 10, G.C.A. and of Article 3 Guam's Recycling Revolving Fund Rules and Regulations of Chapter 24, Division 4, Title 22, G.A.R.R. Some of the proposed amendments of the Bill includes the following:

- §51302 will make the Recycling Revolving Fund (Fund), non-lapsing and maintained separate and apart from any other funds, and that all monies in the Recycling Revolving Fund are to be appropriated, and shall continue to be deemed appropriated, to the Guam Environmental Protection Agency to be expended in accordance with this Article.
- §51303(A) authorizes the Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA) to spend ten percent (10%) of the Fund to administer and implement this article and identifies certain uses.
- §51303(B) authorizes GEPA to spend up \$50,000 to either procure professional services, or fund grants for education and outreach to promote recycling and zero waste. Also proposes in §24302.2(a) Article 3 of Chapter 24, Division 4, Title 22, G.A.R.R.
- §51303(C) upon approval by the Board, the Administrator is authorized to spend up to \$200,000 to either procure professional and technical services, or fund grants to update and further develop the Guam Zero Waste Masterplan and a holistic government and island-wide Zero Waste implementation plan. Also proposed in §24302.2(b) Article 3 of Chapter 24, Division 4, Title 22, G.A.R.R.
- §51303(D) provides for the General Terms and Conditions for Use of Funds.
- §51309 authorizes the Administrator to establish a Zero Waste Grant Program and to spend up to \$400,000 for zero waste grants.
- §51310 will establish the Guam Solid Waste Authority Residential Recycling Program, and authorizes the Administrator to reimburse Guam Solid Waste Authority, up to \$400,000 in accordance with the Guam Zero Waste Masterplan.

The Bill also removes §51306 Recycling Fees, Article 3 of Chapter 51, Title 10, G.C.A. and adds to §24301.3 Fees, Article 3 of Chapter 24, Division 4, Title 22, G.A.R.R.

The proposed legislation also adds new section to Article 3 of Chapter 24, Division 4, Title 22, Guam Annotated Rules and Regulations;

§24301.4 General Terms and Conditions for Use of Recycling Revolving Funds

- §24302.1 Administration of Recycling Revolving Fund
- §24302.2 Planning of Recycling Revolving Fund
- §24303.8 Zero Waste Grant Program Reserve
- §24303.9 Guam Solid Waste Authority Residential Recycling Program Reserve
