Notes:

The proposed legislation intends to add a new §181005 to Article 10, Chapter 18, Title 22 Guam Code Annotated (GCA) relative to including Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA) screening in health insurance coverage per the recommendation of the United States Preventive Services Task Force.

Per correspondence with the Department of Administration (DOA), the Request for Proposal (RFP) for FY 2023 health insurance coverage is currently in the process of being finalized. Further, it is possible for the health insurance negotiating team to inquire from insurance carriers whether there would be an effect on quoted premiums were the AAA screening to be mandated for inclusion. As such, DOA is unable to determine the effect on Government of Guam medical insurance rates at this time. DOA also notes that the Medically Indigent Program (MIP) Jurisdiction E reimbursement for CPT code 76706 is \$219.59. However, without an estimated volume, DOA is unable to reach a meaningful estimated impact for this fiscal note.
