

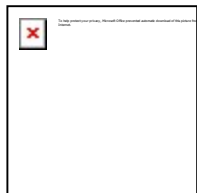

**III. Approved of Minutes**

Move to approved BOT minutes on February 4, 2021, by Vicente Meno, seconded by Catherine Flores, minutes was unanimously passed.

**IV. President's Report**

Treasurer report by Marilyn Reyes, Non appropriate account for the President's office, Research, Publication & Training and the Guam Museum Fund. Guam Museum Fund no activity, status quo same as President Office. Research, Publication & Training, books are still being sold, will work with new AO Jayne Borja to update account.

President Melvin Won Pat-Borja, Guam Cultural Repository, moving along with the MOU on repository, issues with SHPO on the transferring of artifact, working on a new MOU with SHPO to established on how to facilitate the transfer. When the document is finalize on the language side and reviewed it will be sent to the AG office for reviewed.

Administrative Officer position had been filled by Jayna Borja, we have three (3) new Museum Assistants that have been activated and to start making progress on the transition. Museum Curator, list was not sufficient, this position is critical. Dr. Michael Bevacqua, was rated by DOA, HR and was qualify, will be hired as an LTA (Limited Time Appointment), we still allow DOA to continue the announcement for the Curator, to keep it open, and we need to actively recruit.

My intention is to increase the budget so we can be competitive. The Curator is being hired at a step 1, we want to be competitive at a national level, and we should be hiring a curator at a step 10, this is the most critical position in the museum.

CHamoru Village, most urgent item, we are in the hole of about \$87K in arrears for utilities, due to nonpayment from tenants, the water is a result of a fundamental flaw in our system, under a unified account with sub meters, when the tenant falls behind, it doesn't get disconnected, it's all connected to the same systems. The quickest way is to pay the account by using the contractual account, which is great for us, so we don't deal with media and disconnecting the tenants, now too fine a way to replenish what we lost out on the contractual fund, working closely with BBMR, DOA, and the GOV OFFICE, to ensure that we will be able to replenish these accounts and not to have interruption in service with the museum side. AO is working on making the payment. We will be recruiting for the Administrative Assistance, interview will be next week. ONLINE authorization for the CHamoru Village, need a motion to update the names to President Melvin Won Pat-Borja and Jennifer Paulino, Motion to update banking authorization by Vicente Meno, and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Catherine Flores and Leonard Iriarte, motion carries.

**V. Old Business**

President Melvin Won Pat-Borja, Guam Museum capacity by Public Health is still the same, trying to determine how to deal with rental spaces, but more importantly the exhibit space, all museum exhibits are still close, our team develop an SOP, it deals with guide lines and a safe way to open our doors. Waiting for Public Health to approve our guide lines.


**VI. New Business**





# US open to discussing wider path to nuclear deal with Iran

PARIS — Efforts to sketch out initial U.S. and Iranian steps to resume compliance with the 2015 nuclear deal have stalled and Western officials believe Iran may now wish to discuss a wider road map to revive the pact, something Washington is willing to do.

President Joe Biden's aides initially believed Iran, with which they have not had direct discussions, wanted to talk about first steps toward a revival of the agreement that Biden's predecessor, Donald Trump, abandoned in 2018.

The agreement eased economic sanctions on Tehran in return for curbs to the Iranian nuclear program designed to make it harder to develop an atomic weapon — an ambition Tehran denies.

Three Western officials said the Biden administration and Iran had mainly communicated indirectly via European parties to the deal — Britain, France and Germany — and that they believe Iran now wants to discuss a broader plan to return to the pact.

"What we had heard was that they

were interested first in a series of initial steps, and so we were exchanging ideas on a series of initial steps" said a U.S. official who, like others cited in this story, spoke on condition of anonymity.

"It sounds from what we are hearing publicly now, and through other means, that they may be ... not interested in (discussing) initial steps but in a road map for return to full compliance," he said.

"If that's what Iran wants to talk about, we are happy to talk about it,"

the U.S. official added.

It is not clear, however, whether that is Iran's stance.

Iran's nuclear policy is ultimately determined by Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, who said flatly on March 21 that "the Americans must lift all sanctions" before Tehran would resume compliance.

"If sanctions are ... really canceled, we will return to our obligations without any problems," Khamenei said. "We have a lot of patience and we are not in a hurry."

## Honduran president's brother gets life in prison in US for drug trafficking

NEW YORK (Reuters) — Tony Hernandez, a former Honduran congressman and brother of the sitting president, was sentenced to life in prison plus 30 years for drug trafficking by a U.S. judge on Tuesday.

Hernandez, 42, was convicted on the drug charges and related weapons charges in October 2019. Hernandez will also be forced to pay \$138.5 million in forfeiture, which prosecutors in their sentencing memo here wrote was "blood money" from drug trafficking.

"This is state-sponsored drug trafficking and this is exactly the type

of conduct the government should be targeting, because of the impact it has on Honduras," U.S. prosecutor Matthew Laroche said. "Honduras is one of the principal drug transshipment places in the world and one of the most violent places in the world."

Laroche went on to say that the "depth of corruption" set Hernandez's case apart.

"He secured protection from investigation, arrest and extradition by paying massive bribes to politicians, like his brother, and like (former president) Porfirio Lobo Sosa," Laroche said.

He said Hernandez had accepted

millions in bribes, including \$1 million from El Chapo Guzman, to funnel into the ruling National Party's coffers for elections in 2009, 2013, and 2017 to benefit his brother, President Juan Orlando Hernandez.

President Hernandez has denied the allegations and he has not been charged with a crime.

"Based upon Tony Hernandez' free choice to engage in a life of drug trafficking for 12 years, a sentence of life imprisonment is richly deserved," U.S. District Judge Kevin Castel said in federal court in Manhattan.

Tony Hernandez's lawyer Peter Brill said he plans to appeal.

## Indonesia recovers cockpit voice recorder of crashed aircraft

JAKARTA (Reuters) — Indonesia's transport ministry said on Wednesday it had recovered the cockpit voice recorder of a Sriwijaya Air jet that crashed into the Java Sea shortly after take-off on Jan. 9, killing all 62 people on board.

A preliminary report by investigators into the Sriwijaya crash said the plane had an imbalance in engine thrust that eventually led the plane into a sharp roll and then a final dive into the sea.

A news conference to discuss the find will be held at 11 a.m. local time, according to a media invitation from the ministry sent to reporters.

A navy spokesman, La Ode Muhammad Holib, told Reuters that the CVR was found on Wednesday. A ministry spokeswoman declined to comment on whether it was in good condition.

Divers found the casing and beacon of the CVR from the 26-year-old Boeing Co 737-500 within days of the crash but had spent nearly three months searching for the memory unit in relatively shallow but muddy waters that sometimes attract strong currents.

It took a similar amount of time to recover the CVR of the Lion Air 737 MAX that crashed in nearby waters in 2018.

### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Guam Public Utilities Commission [PUC] will conduct a public hearing on Guam Power Authority's [GPA] Petition for Creation of a new Energy Storage Rate. The public hearing will commence at 6:30 p.m. on April 13, 2021, at Conference Room, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, GCIC Building, 414 West Soledad Avenue, Hagatna, Guam.

GPA's proposal would be applicable to all new Net Energy Metering (NEM) customers who install a solar PV or wind turbine system after the Energy Storage Rate is approved by the PUC. NEM customers would elect to either: (1) use Frequency Control Capability or an Energy Storage System (ESS) with the installation of a new solar PV or wind turbine system; or (2) pay to GPA a monthly charge of \$2.43 per kW pursuant to the Energy Storage Rate Schedule.

GPA believes that NEM Customers receive services from the grid subsidized by non-NEM customers including, but not limited to: (1) Use of the grid to sell power (get credit at full retail rate for excess production); (2) Use of the grid to energize their homes at night, but credited back from their production (uses island power grid as storage); (3) Frequency regulation absorbed by grid for intermittencies; (4) Reactive power supply; (5) Voltage regulation; and (6) Stand-by power on overcast days that cannot produce sufficient power generation.

The current over 24MW of net metering capacity, without ESS or Frequency Control Capability, are alleged to result in significant intermittency which degrades the reliability of the island wide power system. According to GPA, the number of automatic under-frequency load shedding events have increased substantially over the past few years due to intermittency of solar PV systems tied into the island's power grid. The addition of intermittent energy into the grid has and will continue to degrade system reliability and has led to substantial outages due to solar PV intermittency.

The purpose of the public hearing will be to provide PUC with public input and comment to assist it in determining whether GPA's proposal should be adopted. After the public hearings, at its next regularly scheduled meeting, the PUC will determine the appropriate action to be taken on GPA's Petition.

Interested parties may review GPA's Petition for Creation of a new Energy Storage Rate at the PUC Website, [www.guampuc.com](http://www.guampuc.com), or at the PUC Office, Suite 207, GCIC Bldg., Hagatna. Copies of documents related to the Petition will be maintained at the PUC Office.

Interested persons may participate in the public hearing pursuant to Public Law 23-30:1, by application to the PUC at Suite 207, GCIC Building Hagatna. PUC will also welcome public comments, whether oral or written. Public comments will be entertained in the order registered with PUC staff at Suite 202 GCIC Building, commencing at 6:15 p.m. on the evening of the hearing.

PUC will also invite public comments on GPA's Petition at additional hearings, which have been scheduled for the public's convenience in accordance with Public Law 26-23 and will be held at the following locations and times:

6:30 p.m. April 14, 2021, Asan Community Center  
6:30 p.m. April 15, 2021, Dededo Senior Citizens Center

Public comments at the supplemental hearings will be welcomed in the order registered with PUC staff prior to the hearings.
