AN ACT TO AMEND § 17116 AND REPEAL § 17118 CHAPTER 17, TITLE 3, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CHANGING PRELIMINARY REPORTS TO QUARTERLY REPORTS AND ELIMINATING FINAL AND SUPPLEMENTARY REPORTS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM 2 **Section 1.** § 17116. Of Chapter 17, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated [Election 3 Campaign Contributions & Expenditures], is hereby *amended* to read: 4 § 17116. Preliminary Reports. Quarterly Reports. 5 Each candidate, or authorized person in the case of a political party, or 6 campaign treasurer in the case of a committee, shall file a preliminary 7 quarterly report with the Election Commission on forms provided by the 8 Election Commission not later than the tenth (10th) day prior to each election or primary, as the case may be. The reports shall be certified 9 pursuant to § 17103 of this Chapter and shall contain the following 10 11 information, which is to be current through the fifteenth (15th) calendar day 12 prior to the election or primary: (a) the aggregate sum of all contributions received; 13

1	(b) the amount_and date of deposit of the contribution and the
2	name and address of each donor who contributes an aggregate
3	of more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00);
4	(c) all expenditures made, incurred, or authorized by or for a
5	candidate, including the name and address of each payee and the
6	amount, date, and purpose of each expenditure; and
7	(d) a current statement of the balance on hand or deficit.
8	(a) Each candidate, political party, or committee, shall file a
9	quarterly report with the Election Commission on forms
10	provided by the Election Commission not later than the fifteenth
11	(15th) day after the last day of each calendar quarter, id est April
12	15, July 15, October 15, and January 15; the first of which shall
13	be due after the first complete quarter following the filing of the
14	candidate or committee's Organizational Report. The reports
15	shall be certified pursuant to § 17103 of this Chapter and shall
16	contain the following information:
17	(1) the aggregate sum of all contributions received;
18	(2) the amount, date of receipt, and date of deposit (when
19	applicable) of the contribution and the name and address
20	of each donor who makes a contribution of more than
21	One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00);
22	(3) all expenditures made, incurred, or authorized by or
23	for a candidate, including the name and address of each
24	payee and the amount, date, and purpose of each
25	expenditure; and

2	(b) A candidate, party, or committee that receives no
3	contributions or makes no expenditures shall nevertheless file
4	quarterly reports as required by law, the last of which shall be
5	due not later than the fifteenth (15th) day after the last day of the
6	calendar quarter following the primary, general, or special
7	election.
8	(c) Every candidate, party, or committee shall file quarterly
9	reports until one of the following conditions is met:
10	(1) The depletion of campaign funds or the elimination of
11	any remaining deficit;
12	(2) The establishment of a new organization designated
13	explicitly for a subsequent campaign, under the condition that the
14	new organization pertains to the same electoral office in the case
15	of a candidate or serves the same purpose or addresses the same
16	issue in the case of a committee; or
17	(3) The transfer any remaining surplus or deficit to a new
18	organization expressly designated for a campaign related to a
19	distinct electoral office or issue, which is not the same office or
20	issue currently or previously held by a candidate, party, or
21	committee.
22	Section 2. § 17118. Of Chapter 17, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated [Election
23	Campaign Contributions & Expenditures], is hereby repealed.
24	§ 17118. Final and Supplemental Reports.
25	(a) Each candidate whether or not successful in a primary or
26	special primary election, or authorized person in the case of a party, or

campaign treasurer in the case of a committee, shall file a final primary 1 report not later than the tenth (10th) day after the primary or special 2 primary election, certified pursuant to § 17103 of this Chapter. The 3 4 report shall include: 5 (1) a statement of the total contributions received; (2) the amount and date of deposit of the contribution, and 6 7 the name and address of each donor who contributes more 8 than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00); and (3) a statement of all expenditures made or incurred by or 9 10 for a candidate, including the name of each payee and the amount, date, and purpose of each expenditure. 11 12 (b) Each candidate, or authorized person in the case of a committee, shall file a final general report with the Election 13 Commission not later than the twentieth (20th) day after a general or 14 15 special election, certified pursuant to § 17103 of this Chapter, and reporting all items prescribed in Subsection (a) of this Section. A 16 candidate who is unsuccessful in a primary or special primary election 17 need not file a final general report. 18 19 (c) Deficit. In the event of a deficit, the candidate or authorized person in the case of a committee shall, every three (3) months until the 20 deficit is eliminated, file a supplemental report, the first of which shall 21 be due not later than sixty (60) days following the election. 22 (d) Surplus. In the event of a surplus, the candidate or authorized 23 person in the case of a committee shall: (1) maintain the cash surplus in 24 a financial depository; and (2) every six (6) months, until he or she 25 26 becomes a candidate again, file supplemental reports reporting all items

1	prescribed in Subsection (a) of this Section. The first report shall be due
2	not later than sixty (60) days after the election.
3	(e) A candidate, party, or committee that receives no
4	contributions or makes no expenditures shall nevertheless file
5	preliminary, final, and supplemental reports as required by law.
6	Section 3. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective immediately upon
7	enactment.
8	Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any
9	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall
10	not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect
11	without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
12	Act are severable.
