REQUESTING I MAGA'HAGAN RELATIVE TO GUÅHAN ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF GUAM TO UTILIZE MONEY GIVEN TO HER THROUGH THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN (ARP) ACT OF 2021 TO **FUND THE TWENTY MILLION DOLLARS (\$20,000,000)** SOUGHT IN BILL 75-37 (LS) TO ASSIST ISLAND BUSINESSES STILL STRUGGLING AS A RESULT OF LOSSES DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND INFLATIONARY EVENTS, AND THE TWENTY SIX MILLION THREE HUNDRED EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$26,381,000) SOUGHT IN BILL 87-37 (LS) TO EXTEND THE PRUGRÅMAN AYUDA PARA I TAOTAO-TA ENERGY CREDIT PROGRAM FOR ANOTHER FIVE MONTHS.

- 3 WHEREAS, on March 14, 2020, Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero signed
- 4 Executive Order 2020-03 declaring a state of emergency to respond to Novel
- 5 Coronavirus (COVID-19) in Guam; and

WHEREAS, in the days ensuing the state of emergency, a great majority of local businesses were ordered to close their doors or severely restrict their operations to avoid the spread of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 2020-03 was the first of many subsequent orders that forced businesses to change how they routinely operated, added costs that they would not have normally had, and lose revenues that they would have normally relied on; and

WHEREAS, during the COID-19 state of emergency, businesses were subjected to mandates that included temporary closures, service restrictions, limit in operations, purchasing of hygienic and protective equipment, and vaccination requirements. The adherence and compliance to many of the mandates put a strain on the operational capabilities and finances of the companies that many of them had no choice but to either shutter their businesses temporarily or close permanently; and

WHEREAS, one of the hardest hit industries during the pandemic was tourism. In 2019, Guam welcomed over 1.66 million tourists, but in 2020, our island had only 328,173 visitors, an 81% reduction. In 2021, the numbers were even bleaker, with just 48,859 visitors through the month of August; and

WHEREAS, tourism-related businesses reported an 80% loss in revenue in 2020 when compared to 2019, and in 2021, the income loss was closer to 100%; and

WHEREAS, the latest information on the Guam Department of Labor website shows that in December 2022, Guam's private sector was made up of 49,220 employees earning a weekly average of Six Hundred Twenty-Seven Dollars and Six Cents (\$627.06) while the Government of Guam employs 12,260 employees earning One Thousand One Hundred Forty Dollars (\$1,140.00) average weekly; and

WHEREAS, while many private sector employees either experienced a tremendous loss in working hours or were laid off because of COVID-19 restrictions and closures. Government of Guam employees were not subjected to a reduction in

hours or pay, nor was any employee furloughed or laid off, in fact some were even compensated more; and

WHEREAS, due to external factors other than COVID-19 related matters such as the war in Ukraine and supply chain issues, the cost of living has risen to levels that have made it difficult for families pay for basic necessities such as water, power, food, and gas; and

WHEREAS, while Government of Guam employees have been provided regular paychecks, pay increases, upward pay adjustments, and incentive/retention pays since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, the majority of the island's workforce were forced to tap into their savings, apply for financial assistance, or leave their island home to seek employment elsewhere; and

WHEREAS, while *I Liheslatura* works to find means and monies to help all island businesses and residents with their struggle to get back on their feet and make ends meet, currently with Bills 75-37 (LS) and 87-37 (LS), the funding source identified in both bills is inadequate to fully fund both measures; and

WHEREAS, the balance that remains in the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 that the Governor has full authority and control of is more than sufficient to provide the Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) that is being sought for Bill 75-37 (LS) and the Twenty Six Million Three Hundred and Eighty One Thousand Dollars (\$26,381,000) being sought for Bill 87-37 (LS); and

WHEREAS, I Maga'Hågan Guåhan has the authority and ability to fully fund the programs that will assist struggling island businesses and their employees and further provide financial relief to Guam Power Authority customers. This action will help in directing the limited funding available in the excess General Fund to other urgent matters such as addressing our crime problem, ensuring that our schools are healthy environments for learning, and our hospital gets the critical attention it needs.
