Relative to recognizing Pastor Remenster Jano, for dedicating fifty (50) years of his life and career to the community and his church; and to commend him for his contributions to the community and the impact he has made on the island of Guam on the occasion of his retirement from the Guam-Micronesia Mission of Seventh-day Adventists; and to congratulate Pastor Remenster and Leah Jano on their fiftieth (50th) wedding anniversary.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN

2 **GUÅHAN:**

WHEREAS, after graduating from Palau Mission Academy in 1969, Pastor Jano returned home to Ponape and was hired as a clerk for the Ponape Federation of Cooperative Association where he worked for six (6) months. With enough money earned to pay for his airfare to Manila, Philippines, combined with the support and financial sponsorship of Pastor Frank and Mariquita Taitague, Remenster successfully completed his degree in the field of Theology at Philippine Union College (PUC) in 1973; and WHEREAS, on June 13, 1973, Pastor Remenster and Leah Jano were wed at the
 home of Dr. and Mrs. Gensolin at Philippine Union College by Pastor Vito, the senior
 Pastor of the PUC Church; and

4 WHEREAS, following his graduation from PUC, Pastor Jano began as a 5 ministerial intern under Pastor Frank Taitague for eight (8) months at the Seventh-day 6 Adventist (SDA) church in Kolonia, Ponape. He then moved on to become the District 7 Coordinating Pastor in Ponape for thirteen (13) years and also served as Acting 8 Principal from 1973 to 1980 for Pohnpei SDA School. Pastor Jano was especially 9 instrumental in the building of a new church on Sapwaufic Atoll in 1981. He also played 10 a significant role in acquiring from the government the piece of land in Dolonier, Nett 11 Municipality, Ponape where the school is presently located. It eventually led to the 12 construction of the elementary and high school, including a gymnasium, administration 13 building, and housing facility for the teachers; and

WHEREAS, in 1986, Pastor Remenster and Leah, with their two (2) children,
Jeanette and Joycelynn, moved to Chuuk to pastor the SDA church in Weno. While in
Chuuk, he helped in the erection of the elementary school administration building and
housing building for teachers. He also directed the construction of the Weno SDA
Church; and

WHEREAS, in 1989, Pastor Jano moved his family back to the Philippines to further his and his wife's education. He graduated with two (2) Master of Arts degrees, one in Pastoral Studies in 1990 and another in Religious Education in 1991, from the Adventist International Institute of Advanced Studies (AIIAS). His wife Leah also attained a Master of Public Health (MPH) degree from the Adventist University of Philippines (AUP); and

WHEREAS, in 1991, Pastor Remenster and Leah returned to Ponape to work at
 the Kitti SDA Church as head pastor for one year, while their children remained at AUP
 to continue their college studies; and

WHEREAS, in 1993, he was invited to relocate to Guam in order to serve as a
pastor of the Dededo SDA Church. After one year, he was elected by the Southern Asia

Pacific Division to serve as the Executive Secretary of the Guam-Micronesia Mission
while continuing to serve as pastor at the Dededo SDA Church for another two (2) years.
It was during this time that he directed the rebuilding and construction of a new church
building. It was also during this period that he facilitated the merging of the Dededo
and Northern SDA churches, which later, in 1997, became the Guam Korean SDA
Church; and

7 WHEREAS, not long thereafter, he was requested to become the pastor of the 8 Talo'fo'fo SDA Church while maintaining his duties as GMM Executive Secretary. His 9 wife Leah began her employment as a registered nurse at the Guam Seventh-day 10 Adventist Clinic. From 1999 to 2003, he additionally carried out the responsibilities of 11 the Sabbath School Director and Personal Ministries Director for the mission. He also 12 served as PARL (Public Affairs and Religious Liberty) Director and coordinated the 13 LEAD (Leadership, Education, and Development) Program of Guam-Micronesia Mission; and 14

WHEREAS, then in 2003, Pastor Jano was elected to a servant leadership position as President of Guam-Micronesia Mission. In his first year, he witnessed the severe damages to Guam's churches and school incurred by enormous-strength typhoons, then the rebuilding of these facilities to a level that reinforced them to withstand comparable or high typhoon strengths; and

WHEREAS, Pastor Jano also saw the establishment of the Adventist work in three (3) new areas, namely Enilok in Ebon Atoll in the Marshall Islands, and the islands of Tinian and Rota in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. Three (3) new companies were also established, one in Guam and two in the Marshall Islands. In 2006, Rota and Tinian companies were organized to become sister companies of the mission; and

WHEREAS, Pastor Jano has been blessed with fifty (50) years of loving service for the Lord, his church, and his marriage to Leah. He has been further blessed to see his family grow with eight (8) grandchildren and two (2) great grandchildren; now therefore, be it **RESOLVED,** that *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize Pastor Remenster Jano, for dedicating fifty (50) years of his life and career to the community and his church; and to commend him for his contributions to the community and the impact he has made on the island of Guam on the occasion of his retirement from the Guam-Micronesia Mission of Seventhday Adventists; and to congratulate Pastor Remenster and Leah Jano on their fiftieth (50th) wedding anniversary; and be it further
