**Relative to recognizing Jose Ulloa Garrido for his contributions toward the protection, preservation, promotion, and perpetuation of CHamoru history, culture, language, art, and indigenous rights of the people of Guam; and for his commitment, dedication, and continued advocacy for the CHamoru people supporting Guam War Claims, the return of ancestral lands, and the political right of self-determination.**

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I**  
2 ***MINA'TRENTAISJETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS**, Jose Ulloa Garrido from Hagåtña and Asan was born to Vicente  
4 Pangelinan Garrido and Maria Ulloa Garrido on March 31, 1944 in Unguaguan,  
5 Barrigada. He is one of eight children, his siblings include Julia Limtiaco, Ignacio  
6 Garrido, Magdalena Cruz, Maria Garrido, Vicente Garrido, Conchita Limtiaco, and  
7 Patricia Garrido; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Jose Ulloa Garrido graduated from George Washington High  
9 School and entered the workforce beginning a career as a Journeyman Machinist  
10 PWC. He was on active duty from 1963 to 1965. He served in the U.S. Army Reserve  
11 from 1978 to 1990 and the National Guard from 1991 until his retirement in 2005;  
12 and

1           **WHEREAS**, Jose Ulloa Garrido also worked at Pepsi Cola Bottling  
2 Company, the Piti Power Plant in Federal Civil Service, and the Department of Parks  
3 and Recreation - Historic Resources Division; and

4           **WHEREAS**, Jose Ulloa Garrido was known for his advocacy in the  
5 community. He lent his voice for the indigenous rights of the CHamoru People and  
6 in pursuit of our political right of Self-Determination. He spoke many times on  
7 behalf of the Na'sion CHamoru including as a Petitioner at the United Nations in  
8 New York in 1997 where he alongside a delegation from Guam spoke objecting to  
9 an omnibus draft resolution by the Special Committee on Decolonization; and

10           **WHEREAS**, additionally, he was very vocal about advocating to have the  
11 people that died before December 24, 2015 to be included in the War Reparation  
12 Claims. Jose Ulloa Garrido appeared in front of the Guam Legislature on a number  
13 of occasions in support of making the Guam World War II claims whole by  
14 including all War Survivors regardless of death status; and

15           **WHEREAS**, Jose Ulloa Garrido lent his time and expertise to a number of  
16 nonprofit, volunteer, and advocacy organizations including as a Member of Na'sion  
17 CHamoru (Chamorro Nation) where he served as Maga'låhi, Co-founding Member  
18 of Ancestral Landowners Coalition, an NGO advocating for the return of CHamoru  
19 ancestral homelands in Guam, and as Petitioner at the United Nations in New York;  
20 and

21           **WHEREAS**, Jose Ulloa Garrido is an accomplished artist, specializing in  
22 pencil medium, some of his prized drawings include an authentic depiction of our  
23 ancient CHamoru Chiefs; and an avid researcher and practitioner in the etymology  
24 of the CHamoru language and CHamoru place names; and

25           **WHEREAS**, Jose Ulloa Garrido retired from the Department of Parks and  
26 Recreation Historic Preservation Division. He continues to advocate for the  
27 Chamoru culture and heritage; and

1           **WHEREAS**, Jose Ulloa Garrido currently resides in the village of Dededo,  
2 he is married to his wife of fifty-one (51) years, Carolyn Respicio Garrido. Together  
3 they have two children, Raul V.R. Garrido and Darlene Perez; and Joshua A.R.  
4 Garrido and Ladisa Quintanilla; he has three grandchildren, Kameron Garrido,  
5 Shade Garrido, and Ashton Garrido; and one great granddaughter, Hailey Garrido;  
6 now therefore, be it

7           **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Siette Na*  
8 *Liheslaturan Guahan* on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize Jose Ulloa Garrido  
9 for his contributions toward the protection, preservation, promotion, and  
10 perpetuation of CHamoru history, culture, language, art, and indigenous rights of the  
11 people of Guam; and for his commitment, dedication, and continued advocacy for  
12 the CHamoru people supporting Guam War Claims, the return of ancestral lands,  
13 and the political right of self-determination; and be it further

14           **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on  
15 Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that  
16 copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Jose Ulloa Garrido; and to the  
17 Honorable Lou Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hågan Guahan*.
