WHEREAS, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is observed each year on the third (3) Monday in January and is designated as a National Day of Service to encourage volunteers to improve their communities. MLK Day commemorates the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and his selfless call to help his neighbors and communities by promoting his message of equality, social justice, and opportunity for all by his vision of a "Beloved Community"; and

WHEREAS, Dr. King is honored for his movement that revolutionized the country in which freedom is bound to the freedom of others. He fought for civil rights, international peace, creating jobs, and economic justice. Dr. King exemplifies how life should be lived, by bringing fairness, abide by principles, and bringing goodness to all; and


