WHEREAS, in the early 1940's the United States Government authorized "The Manhattan Project" a top-secret testing and development program; and

WHEREAS, in July 1945, the first atomic bomb successfully exploded at the "Trinity Testing Site" by the United States Government, instituting the beginning of the nuclear era; and

WHEREAS, after embarking into World War II, the United States Government commissioned the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to build considerable quantities of plants, laboratories, and testing sites; and

WHEREAS, the United States Government expanded testing in the South Pacific and failed to warn of the dangers of exposure to radiation, especially to surrounding areas downwind; and

WHEREAS, thousands of Pacific Islanders including the people of Guam were affected by the detonations of nuclear bombs; and

WHEREAS, the National Research Council concluded that, "Guam received measurable radiation from atmospheric testing in the Pacific", and

WHEREAS, the residents of Guam during that time period were recommended to be included in the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act (RECA) as downwinders; and

WHEREAS, the Pacific Association for Radiation Survivors (PARS) advocated to extend and expand RECA to include Guam survivors who were harmed by U.S. nuclear testing as "downwinders" under RECA; and

WHEREAS, 1 Liheslaturan Guåhan has always supported the inclusion of Guam and the passage of S. 2798 and H. 5338, introduced in the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives on September 22, 2021, which would amend the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act to include Guam as a downwinder of the U.S. Pacific test sites, extend the fund claims period, and improve compensation and benefits since the 1 Mina benti Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan (the 27th Guam Legislature); and
