WHEREAS, ISG Manglona has held every leadership position, to include UH-60 Maintenance Supervisor, Senior Crew Chief, and Company First Sergeant; and one of his previous assignments was serving as the First Sergeant for the 25th Combat Aviation Brigade, Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC), and his stateside assignments include Fort Hood, Texas, Joint Base Lewis McChord, Washington, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, and Fort Campbell, Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, one of 1SG Manglona's overseas assignments was serving at Camp Stanley in South Korea, while his overseas deployments included Operation Iraqi Freedom (Liberation of Iraq, Transition of Iraq, and Iraq Governance), and the Afghanistan Campaign (Consolidation II and III); and
