In light of the anticipated restoration of the island to COR 4 at 10 am on October 11, 2023, the emergency legislative session relative to Guam Memorial Hospital, postponed due to Typhoon Bolaven, will be called to order at 2 pm, October 11, 2023.

In light of the conditions confirmed at a recent GMHA Oversight hearing and audit, as Speaker, I hereby certify that emergency conditions exist which justify an emergency session regarding the Guam Memorial Hospital.

Further, consistent with the Governor's EO 2023-11 and the President of the United States' declaration of emergency for Guam, I also certify that emergency conditions exist as a result of the recent Typhoon Bolaven which justify an emergency session.

- 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAL SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN

- 3 **WHEREAS**, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) is a critical and
- 4 vital public resource which must be a priority and receive ongoing adequate funding
- 5 and attention. At no point should GMHA lack critical medication and supplies because

funding or support is not provided by the Administration as it is the last line of lifesaving defense for tens of thousands of Guamanians; and

WHEREAS, GMHA has been operating unaccredited since 2018, compromising the delivery of quality, compassionate life-saving medical care for the island's sick and dying, and threatening the hospital's ability to meet the minimum health and safety standards by the Social Security Act that is required of providers and suppliers participating in the Medicare and Medicaid programs; and

WHEREAS, meeting the basic standards set by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services required for certification should be the utmost priority for Guam's leaders as more than One Billion Dollars (\$1,000,000,000) have been received through the CARES Act, the American Rescue Plan Act, and other federal financial resources that should have been used for GMHA'S facility rehabilitation and operations since 2020; and

WHEREAS, through testimony entered into the public record that was provided in person and in writing to *I Liheslatura*, it has been revealed that GMHA lacks the leadership and resources to procure and provide a steady supply of basic sanitation supplies for medical personnel to deliver dignified care for their patients; and

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2023, in testimony provided by a certified critical care nurse working at GMHA at an oversight hearing on the hospital, the nurse stated, "We regularly lack essential materials like linens and pillows, diabetic tube feeding formula, underpads for patients to poo and pee on, inner tracheostomy cannulas, wipes to clean patients, pre-filled epinephrine syringes for medical emergencies, and so many other things to add to this list." The nurse went on to state, "We didn't have wipes for months. As an alternative, we were told to use paper towels to clean and bathe our patients. To our embarrassment, patients' families witnessed this and have donated

wipes because of the pitiful situation the hospital is in. It is sad and embarrassing and it is disgraceful that you have allowed this to be the standard of care for our people"; and WHEREAS, in further testimony provided by GMHA's Acting Chief Clinical Informatics Officer at the oversight hearing, it was stated, "one of the most alarming consequences of the hospital's financial struggles is the growing number of unpaid vendors. As the hospital fails to meet its financial obligations, vendors supplying vital medical equipment, pharmaceuticals, and other essential supplies are left unpaid. This not only jeopardizes the hospital's ability to operate efficiently but also puts patient care at risk. Urgent action is needed to address this issue and ensure the hospital can continue to procure necessary supplies"; and

WHEREAS, the deplorable conditions at GMHA have deteriorated below acceptable local, national, and international safety standards for both the patients seeking medical attention and the employees who provide life-saving treatment as attested to by practicing health care professionals; and

WHEREAS, during the September 28, 2023 oversight hearing, GMHA's Chief Financial Officer Yukari Hechanova and Acting Associate Administrator of Medical Services, Dr. Dustin Prins, stated for the record that GMHA is currently under credit watch and credit hold with at least sixty (60) vendors and is still not receiving critical medication needed for patients; and

WHEREAS, the 36th Guam Legislature passed, and Governor Lou Leon Guerrero signed into law, legislation to fund and build a brand new hospital that was deemed urgent for Guam. However, the Governor believes that a greater priority should be placed in the construction of a medical complex that would include spaces for public and behavioral health services. While it is clearly understood that a multi-functioning facility is years away from becoming a reality, the need for a proper and adequately functioning hospital is now. So, for the immediate and medium term, the current GMHA

1 facility must be sufficiently funded and made an extreme priority by the elected leaders

2 of our island. The people of Guam cannot wait for a medical complex. Addressing the

issues and concerns of GMHA needs to take precedence and action must be taken now;

4 and

WHEREAS, I Liheslatura finds that through numerous testimonies, official reports, photographs, and constituent complaints, it is clear that the compromised operations, dilapidated facilities, and substandard level of care at the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority necessitates the need for immediate and decisive action to prevent the further deterioration and decomposition of our island's only public hospital; and

WHEREAS, I Liheslatura further finds that without a declaration of a state of emergency with immediate action and diligence from the GMHA leadership and the Governor of Guam to correct the dysfunctional state of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, it will necessitate the call for federal receivership to ensure that proper management, guidance, and support for GMHA to begin the process needed to restore the hospital's ability to provide a deserving and acceptable level of health care for the people of Guam; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, urgently and steadfastly request *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* declare an immediate state of emergency to address the rapidly deteriorating conditions at the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, and to direct funding and resources to assist Guam's only public hospital with its financial challenges, supply deficiencies, and structural rehabilitation and repairs; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be transmitted to the members of the Board of Trustees of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority; to the Honorable Joshua F.
