WHEREAS, according to the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence, nationally, one (1) out of four (4) women and one (1) out of ten (10) men will be victims of domestic violence at some point during their lifetime; and on average, three (3) women are killed every day at the hands of a current or former intimate partner; and
WHEREAS, domestic violence is an abuse of power that tears apart the fabric of families and undermines the well-being of communities; and
WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, domestic violence became a pandemic within a pandemic, with many victims facing the added pressures of increased economic insecurity, and

an increased time in isolation; and
WHEREAS, the Office of the Attorney General of Guam has established through Public Law 31-103, entitled the "Family Violence Registry Act," a website designed to help ensure the safety
and well-being of the public by providing any person who utilizes this website with an opportunity to obtain information relating to the criminal history records of offenders who have repeat
convictions of family, domestic, or dating violence, and/or stalking, and
WHEREAS, the goal of the Family Violence Registry is to ensure the public's safety through providing a greater sense of security to the community by enhancing the community's avareness
through having information readily available in a central database system that is accessible to the public at no cost; and that the website provides the public with a foreknowledge of the offender's
criminal history records on family, domestic or dating violence, and/or stalking, and in some circumstances, criminal sexual conduct, and aggravated assault convictions which ensures that this
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information protects the public from repeat offenders, and the prevention of further victimization; and
WHEREAS, according to the Office of the Attorney General of Guam's Fiscal Year 2019 Citizen-Centric Report, family violence was one of the highest reported crimes on Guam, with three

WHEREAS, according to the Office of the Attorney General of Guam's Fiscal Year 2019 Citizen-Centric Report, family violence was one of the highest reported crimes on Guam, with three hundred sixty-six (366) reported cases; and
WHEREAS, a survey conducted in September 2019 by the National Network to End Domestic Violence reported that, in a twenty-four (24) hour period, twenty-seven (27) victims of domestic violence on Guam, and their children, received life-saving services from local domestic violence organizations; and
WHEREAS, according to the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center, the twenty-four (24) hour criss hotline was receiving between twenty-five (25) to thirty (30) calls per day during the COVID-19 pandemic, compared to the twenty-five (25) calls it usually receives per month; and
WHEREAS, the Guam Coalition Against Sexual Assault and Family Violence, sexual assault practitioners and advocates, the STOP Violence Against Women, government and non-governmental organizations, faith-based organizations, and other community partners have taken steps to confront Guam's family violence crisis directly and collectively; and
WHEREAS, these community organizations, and other community partners have taken steps to confront Guam's family violence crisis directly and collectively; and
