WHEREAS, Joaquin joined the United States Army in 1969 and was honorably discharged in 1972. He transitioned into civilian life quickly securing a job with the Bank of America. He married Rosemary Mesa in 1973 and they were blessed with three (3) children: Maryusha, Tamara, and Hoaquin II; and WHEREAS, in 2014, Joaquin and his family led a campaign to legalize medicinal marijuana after losing his son Joaquin "KC" Concepcion II, who was a *Chamoru* musician known

WHEREAS, in 2014, Joaquin and his family led a campaign to legalize medicinal marijuana atter fosing his son Joaquin "KC". Concepcion II, who was a CHamori musician known as "Savage K," to gastric cancer in 2013, and after he had moved to the U.S. mainland to seek medical marijuana treatment for his cancer. Guam voters legalized medical marijuana in 2014 under the "Joaquin "KC". Concepcion II Compassionate Cannabis Use Act of 2013," a law that allows the use of medical cannabis on Guam, and

WHEREAS, Joaquin "JC" Concepcion is a well-known musician on Guam who had contributed to the island's music scene since the 1960s; and he also was a longtime radio show host and contributor of a legacy of entertainment, to include his news updates, special faith-based programs, podcasts, music playlists and voiceovers, in pursuit of sharing his love for his island and her people. He is also known as Siñot Kin "JC" Concepcion and has been featured in various media outlets, including "Fino' CHamoru," and "Kuentos Guāhan"; and

WHEREAS, Joaquin Concepcion was a member of the KUAM family who was known affectionately as "Uncle Kin" and his on-air name "JC." He emanated an immense love for his culture, his music, the CHamori language, and his faith; and driven by his passion, every project was pursued with artistic creativity and imagination; and WHEREAS, Joaquin carried that same passion, actively reaching out and diligently assisting constituents with empathy for their concerns regarding land issues while working at

the Office of the Speaker, Senator Therese M. Terlaje of 1. Mina' trentai Sais an Liheslaturan Gudhan (the 36th Guam Legislature), as well as his most recent work with the Kumision i Fino' CHamoru assisting them with CHamoru language policy; and

WHEREAS, Kin's other noteworthy talents were cemented in becoming the first native *CHamoru* to become a Federally Certified Real Estate Appraiser. Even today, much of his research and analysis are used in development planning and regulatory analysis. Music has always been the cornerstone of Joaquin's life. His interest in music was piqued by watching Guam's own local musicians perform. Bedazzled by the guitar, it became his instrument of choice, and he is recognized as a master guitarist. In 1963, he helped form "The Radiants" who became one of the region's best-known bands; and sixty (60) years later, this master guitarist had continued to play with "The Radiants"; and Joaquin has represented Guam at off-island events and is recognized as a mainstay of Guam music; and

DeLeon Guerrero to Hawaii and Washington. He also co-produced, performed, and arranged musical presentations for *CHamoru* singing legends with Meskla Uno in Sacramento, California, Bremerton, Washington; and Las Vegas, Nevada. He co-arranged and produced the *CHamoru* Legends concert in Las Vegas with The Radiants and Guam's legends Johnny Sablan, Jimmy Dee, and Joe McCarrel; and worked with MAJAMAK Productions recording as producer and distributor in the Sentimental Journey Trilogy, and the *Matenggon* Memorial Foundation's "Christmases Not Forgotten" in 2019; and

WHEREAS, Joaquin has always believed that talents are gifts, meant to be shared. He believes that to entertain and put that talent on display is an obligation. Joaquin's parents are a part of "Guam's Greatest Generation," and he performed this obligation to honor their life and existence; and

WHEREAS, Joaquin passed away on Guam on October 5, 2023 at the age of seventy-two (72); and he is survived by his loving wife Rosemary, his sister Teresita, his children Maryusha and Tamara, and his grandchildren, family, and friends who loved him dearly; and his willingness to lend his time, knowledge, and talents, and his love for *CHamoru* music, language, and culture will be forever remembered; now therefore, be it RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mini teretatis Siete Na Libeslaturan Guihan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Libeslaturan Guihan* and the people of Guam, posthumously

He co-arranged and 21 produced the *CHamoru* Legends concert in Las Vegas with The Radiants and Guam's 22 legends Johnny Sablan, Jimmy Dee, and Joe McCarrel; and worked with MAJAMAK 23 Productions recording as producer and distributor in the Sentimental Journey Trilogy, 24 and the Mañenggon Memorial Foundation's "Christmases Not Forgotten" in 2019; and 25 WHEREAS, Joaquin has always believed that talents are gifts, meant to be 26 shared.
