Yudin was the Resident Instruction Coordinator for all undergraduate degree programs at CALS, and he conducted research on subtercanean termites on Guam, the Philippines, and Taiwan; and WHEREAS, from January 2001 to May 2002, Dr. Yudin was appointed to serve as the Interim Associate Director at the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences of the University of Guam (UOG); and his duties as Interm Associate Director included overseeing all Guam Cooperative Extension activities, including administrative responsibilities for both the College and the United States Department of Agriculture; and as part of his administrative responsibilities, Yudin was accountable for an annual budget of around 1.5 Million Dollars, and he also served as a member of the Western Extension Directors Association; and O (JEMIN)

Association; and WHEREAS, Dr. Yudin was appointed to serve as an Acting Dean/Director for CALS in 2002, and he oversaw the Agriculture Experiment Station (AES), a research component of the Land Grant Programs that involved obtaining specific fundamental knowledge which is needed to develop practical solutions to problems facing agriculture and the consumer on Guam; the Guam Cooperative Extension (GCE), an outreach program that delivers research-based information to the people of Guam and the region; and the Resident Instruction (RI) program that includes all administrative responsibilities for the College and related duties with USDA; and WHEREAS, Dr. Yudin was appointed as the Interim Dean of the College of Natural and Applied Sciences (CNAS) and Director of the Western Pacific Tropical Research Center (WPTRC) in 2003; and WHEREAS, together with Alan McClelland, Dr. Yudin was the co-leader of the Pilot Program I of the Cancer Research Training and Faculty Development of the Cancer Research Center Pattnership Planning Grant. The program's specific aim was to increase the number of minority cancer research investigators, with a special emphasis on the development of Pacific Islander investigators from the University of Guam; and
