Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Authority of Guam on its Forty-ninth (49th) Year Anniversary celebration.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN: 2

- 3 WHEREAS, the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port (Port) was established
- as a public corporation and autonomous government agency through the enactment of 4
- Public Law 13-87 on October 31, 1975, providing maritime transportation services to 5
- local, private, federal and military customers as the only commercial seaport on Guam; 6
- 7 and

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- WHEREAS, this year marks the Forty-Ninth (49th) Year Anniversary of the 8
- agency, which has journeyed through a timeline of significant events and developments; 9
- and over the last forty-nine (49) years, the Port has developed into a major 10
- transshipment center for the entire Western Pacific Region; and 11
- 12 WHEREAS, with a total of three hundred eighty-two (382) dedicated employees
- working under the guidance of management and the Board of Directors, the Port has 13

1 made great strides in executing modernization initiatives to provide safe and 2 uninterrupted services to Guam's community and its neighboring islands; and

WHEREAS, the Port is to be commended for the many successes over the past year, including the 2023 Master Plan that will further enhance the Port's core capabilities, achieve resiliency, and implement new strategies based on the agency's financial, operations, and sustainability needs; and

WHEREAS, the Port has grown and evolved into a world-class commercial seaport that has fostered a strong partnership with the U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) INDOPACOM; and it continues to upgrade its facilities and replace its equipment to better serve its commercial customers and DOD'S readiness plans; and

WHEREAS, much success has been achieved by employing financial prudence which resulted in the Port, once again, achieving low-risk auditee status; and this is the fifth (5th) consecutive year that the Port received this designation since the time it failed to obtain this audit opinion in Fiscal Years 2017 and 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Port concluded Fiscal Year 2022 with a net position of \$26.4 Million Dollars, marking a significant increase of \$12.6 million Dollars [or ninety-one percent (91%)] from Fiscal Year 2021's net position of \$13.8 Million Dollars; and with its container count numbers growing from eighty-six thousand seven hundred eighty (86,780) in Fiscal year 2021 to eighty-nine thousand fifty-two (89,052) containers in Fiscal Year 2022, indicating a 2.5% increase; and

WHEREAS, Standard and Poor's (S&P) Global Ratings upholds its outlook for the Port as stable and affirms its 'A' long-term rating on the agency's outstanding series 2018 Port Revenue Bonds. S&P's overall assessment of the Authority's enterprise profile is strong, reflecting very strong economic fundamentals, an adequate market position, and strong governance; and

WHEREAS, Moody's Investors Service maintains its outlook for the Port Authority of Guam as stable (Baa2), pointing to low leverage, strong liquidity, its ability to remain fully operation during the coronavirus pandemic and its ability to support solid debt service coverage and liquidity levels; and

WHEREAS, the island's chief procurement officer renewed the full delegation of procurement authority granted to General Manager Rory J. Respicio pursuant to the Guam Procurement Law. In May 2020, the Port's delegating authority was reinstated after fourteen (14) years of losing its right to procure goods and services on its own; and since then, this delegation has been renewed every year; and

WHEREAS, the Port held groundbreaking ceremonies for two (2) projects that are part of the Port Modernization Program, to include: (1) the Equipment, Maintenance and Repair (EQMR) Building and Warehouse 1 Rehabilitation and Upgrade; and (2) the Waterline Replacement and Relocation Project, which is the relocation of the main sixteen (16)-inch diameter feeder line that will run from Route 11 along the perimeter of the terminal yard; and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2023, the Port Authority of Guam was bestowed with the "First Place Platinum Award" for its Fiscal Year 2021 Citizen-Centric Report (CCR); and this is the second time that the Port has received the "First Place Excellence in Citizen-Centric Reporting Award" from the Association of Government Accountants, Guam Chapter; and

WHEREAS, in April of 2023, the Port Authority of Guam won another national distinguished award for transparency and communications with the public regarding how the agency spends ratepayers dollars, as the National Association of Government Accountants awarded the Port with the "Certificate of Excellence in Citizen-Centric Reporting" for Fiscal year 2022; and

WHEREAS, in 2024, the Port Authority of Guam received notice from the National Association of Government Accountants as they awarded General Manager Rory Respicio with the AGA 2024 Distinguished Local Government Leadership Award. His leadership in maintaining government finances and financial practices allowed to reverse the Port's deficit of one hundred four thousand (104,000) dollars into a surplus of twenty six million four hundred thousand (26.4) dollars; and

**WHEREAS,** on May 29, 2024, the Port Authority of Guam completed the rehabilitation of *Hagat* Marina's Dock B. With the dock finished, the Marina will be able to accommodate up to one hundred sixty two (162) boats improving the infrastructure for recreational boaters. The restrooms received renovations alongside the installation of CCTV cameras to improve the Marina's security; and

WHEREAS, the Port's recovery from the Typhoon Mawar's destruction is a result of the Port management's leadership and the dedicated Port-Strong employees who worked alongside federal, local, and industry partners, which allowed cargo operations to resume just three (3) days after Typhoon Mawar devastated the island; and

WHEREAS, other milestones include numerous PAG projects funded by federal grant awards, Port revenue bonds, and PAG funds. The Port Authority of Guam was awarded the U.S. DOT MARAD Rebuilding America's Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant which initiated environmental and historic review of the project as part of the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA) process to ensure that the project is executed in a sustainable manner that also respects the history of Guam; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority of Guam received funds from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/ Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Port Security Grant Program (PSGP), which awarded One Hundred Twenty-

1 four Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-nine Dollars (\$124,779) in Fiscal Year 2023 for

the acquisition of boat trailers, active shooter personal protection equipment (PPE), and

3 other equipment for Port Police Personnel; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority of Guam received the U.S. DOT MARAD Grant
Cooperative Program, which completed the final remaining project from the \$50
Million Dollar Commercial Port Improvement (GCPI) Program, and submitted the final
close-out report; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority of Guam also received from the Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation (formerly, the Office of Economic Adjustment—OEA) a \$1.45 Million Dollar grant for Owner Agent Engineer services to assist the Port with sustaining and enhancing operational effectiveness, resiliency, sustainability, and contingency survivability of Port infrastructure and equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority of Guam received funds from the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) DIsaster Supplemental Grant Program, which awarded a contract for Architectural and Engineering (A&E) services for the construction of a fuel pipeline to connect F1 Pier and Golf Pier to provide resiliency to Guam's energy industry; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority of Guam also received funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) Diesel Emissions Reduction Act (DERA) Grant Program, which was used to purchase four (4) container yard tractors to upgrade the Port's fleet of container handling equipment; complete the installation of forty-eight (48) moorage buoy systems at the Harbor of Refuge to support both local and transient boaters; and

WHEREAS, the Port Authority of Guam has completed several PAG-funded projects, such as the completion of the Container Freight Station (CFS) Building repainting and spall repair project, as well as awarded projects to construct a new

bathroom facility and install new Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras at the 1 Hagat Marina; and 2 **WHEREAS**, the employees, management, and Board of Directors of the Jose D. 3 Leon Guerrero Commercial Port remain committed to taking on the challenges of 4 5 modernizing the Port in a sustainable manner to meet the ever-changing needs of the island and the region's economic growth; now therefore, be it 6 7 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize the 8 observance of "Port Week" during the week of October 21 to October 25, 2024; and 9 commend the employees, management, and Board of Directors of the Jose D.
