8 WHEREAS, Mr. Joseph (Joey) T. Duenas was born December 28, 1949, son of

the late Jose Camacho Duenas and Ana Torre Franquez Duenas, pioneering proprietors

of various retail businesses in post-World War II Hagåtña to include the Family Shoe

11 Store; and

WHEREAS, as the only son and eldest of four siblings †Sister Anne Mary

Dueñas, CSJ, Jeannene Dueñas Murphy, Mildred T. Dueñas, and Irene Dueñas Meno,

Joey learned from his parents at a very early age, such enduring values of integrity, hard

1 work, love of family, public service, civic responsibility and community engagement

2 that he would emulate over his lifetime; and

four years until 1982; and

WHEREAS, Joey is a 1967 graduate of Father Duenas Memorial High School and a 1971 graduate of Chaminade University of Honolulu, Hawaii; husband of 53 years to Lourdes C. Perez and father of their three children, Jennifer, Mia and their beloved son †Tommy who passed away at the tender age of 16, grandfather of 2 grandchildren, Jennifer Theresa Dueñas Cleare and Stephen A. Cleare, and

WHEREAS, between 1973 to 1983, Joey and his wife Lourdes returned home and took over managing the Family Shoe Store family business working full-time to develop, diversify, and invest family-owned assets into marketable real estate holdings, and in 1984 he succeeded in forming two other family businesses namely, Dueñas, Inc. and JD Investments which still operates today with Joey as its president; and

WHEREAS, in 1978 Joey's love of community and desire to help others led to his appointment on the newly established Guam Community College (GCC) Board of Trustees, established under P.L. 14-77 to convert the Guam Vocational Technical (Vocational Tech) High School into a community college campus, which would consolidate and transfer various pre-existing programs including the Adult Evening School from the Department of Education, UOG's Community Career College & Apprenticeship Training programs, and other similar skills/training programs under the Department of Labor and the Guam Police Department to the auspices of the new Guam Community College, where he served on its Board of Trustees as Vice-Chairman for

WHEREAS, whilst serving on the GCC Board of Trustees and between 1979 and 1981, Joey further served his island community when he joined the American Red Cross Guam Chapter as a member of its Board of Directors helping to promote, fundraise, recruit volunteers, and organize community outreach programs, services, and partnerships to assist and provide emergency food, shelter, relief services and aid to

those in need, ranging from victims of disasters; support services to our military and veterans; and providing such life-saving initiatives as CPR and First Aid training and conducting blood drives to replenish Guam's blood bank supplies; and

WHEREAS, between 1983-1984, Joey also served as President of the Guam Housing Corporation, an autonomous government agency that provides affordable mortgage home loans and rental units, including development of residential subdivisions and construction of housing for rental, for low to moderate income individuals and families; and

WHEREAS, Joey would serve nearly a decade on the newly reformed Public Utility Commission (PUC) as an appointed commissioner and presiding Chairman representing the business sector during the PUC's most formative years from 1985 to 1994, applying his background in economic principles and financial management that were instrumental in establishing and developing regulatory practices, protocols, and rules and regulations to govern the PUC in carrying out its supervisory duties and issuing fair and just ratemaking decisions concerning the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Waterworks Authority, and other regulated entities; and

WHEREAS, between 1995-2001, Joey became the Director of the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation charged with supervision and administration of the Motor Vehicle Division and Regulatory Divisions, the issuance of various licenses, examination of insurance, securities, and banking; Taxpayer Services; Real Property Tax and Tax Enforcement divisions; and the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board; and

WHEREAS, between 1998-2000 Joey also served as Vice-Chairman, then Chairman of the Guam Election Commission, opened a business consulting office (2001-2003); and alongside managing his private family-owned business interests, performing his various public sector duties as a government official in various agencies and governing boards, Joey also managed to contribute his time and energies in several civic organizations: serving as Past President and member of the Rotary Club of Guam;

a proud and active member of the Father Duenas Alumni Association and benefactor in various noteworthy campaigns including the Boy's Chapel and Bell Tower Renaissance and the Phoenix Center projects; and

WHEREAS, a devout Catholic, Eucharistic Minister and parishioner of the Dulce Nombre De Maria Cathedral-Basilica, Joey served the Archdiocese of Agana as its Finance Officer between 2003-2006 and took his turn as a member of Catholic Schools Education Board; and in 2009 and 2012, respectively, Joey received a Papal Lifetime Appointment to the Knight of St. Silvestre in recognition of his active participation and contributions to the activities and work of the Dulce Nombre De Maria Cathedral-Basilica parish and diocese, and a Lifetime Appointment to the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem (EOHSJ) recognizing him for his assiduous practice of Christian faith, his moral conduct, his exemplary involvement in the activities of the Catholic Church at the parish and diocesan levels, his ecumenical spirit and his active interests in the needs and problems of the Holy Land; and

WHEREAS, Joey's retirement after four consecutive elected terms to the Consolidated Commission on Utilities (CCU) represents 25 years in total service to Guam's public water and power utilities, Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) and Guam Power Authority (GPA) respectively:16 years on the elected CCU and 9 previous years (1985-1994) on the Public Utilities Commission (PUC); and

WHEREAS, Joey's 2009-2024 CCU tenure and leadership first as Treasurer, Secretary, and then as CCU Chairman since 2015 marshalled in an era of consistent management, a customer-centric 'one-utility' approach to certain GWA and GPA services and operations, generating savings and efficiencies through the use of technologies, shared assets and resources; helped built unanimity and accord in strategic planning, prioritization, fiscally sound decision-making; and ultimately, enabling both public utilities to attain milestones in their growth as autonomous agencies and guiding

1	them through the most challenging period of infrastructure renewal and investment in							
2	the post-World War II era; and							
3	WHEREAS, for more than 35 years, Mr. Joseph (Joey) T. Dueñas, has							
4	distinguished himself as a model citizen in his various capacities as a successful							
5	businessman, dedicated professional, government official, civic and community leader							
6	and benefactor who by his words, actions and deeds has participated fully, significantly,							
7	and impactfully in the advancing the interests and needs of our island family; now							
8	therefore, be it
