- 3 WHEREAS, Chief Philip S.N. Taijeron, Jr. has served with distinction as an
- 4 Assistant Chief of Customs, embodying the highest standards of professionalism and
- 5 commitment to duty throughout his illustrious career; and
- 6 WHEREAS, as a border enforcement senior executive, Chief Philip S.N.
- 7 Taijeron, Jr. has played a pivotal role in safeguarding Guam's borders, as he tirelessly
- 8 worked to ensure the integrity of the customs and quarantine processes; and

WHEREAS, his leadership and expertise have been instrumental in the interception and seizure of illicit substances, preventing them from infiltrating our community and posing harm to our citizens; and

WHEREAS, Chief Taijeron's remarkable tenure has been characterized by his unwavering dedication to upholding the rule of law, protecting our nation and territory's borders, and preserving the safety and well-being of our people; and

WHEREAS, when faced with complex challenges including diverse managerial and leadership dynamics, pressing operational deadlines, and the impact of global operations on strategic forecasts, Chief Philip S.N. Taijeron, Jr. consistently demonstrated exceptional leadership at Guam Customs. As he embarks on a new chapter following his retirement from government service, we are confident that his strong foundation of knowledge, skills, and abilities will position him for continued success; and

WHERAS, under his guiding watch during the last five years, 552 pounds of methamphetamine and 502 pounds of marijuana were seized. These seizures total street values of \$37.8 million dollars and \$4.5 million dollars, respectively. These dangerous drugs never made it into our community. He authored and instructed Customs Leadership Training titled "Introduction to Leadership Concepts," comprising of six key modules aimed at developing leadership skills among officers and supervisors, benefiting 15 Special Enforcement Division Officers, Customs Officer Supervisors, and Section Officers in Charge; and

WHEREAS, he provided mentorship and editing expertise to a customs committee tasked with drafting a proposal for Customs Entry Manifest Law and Rules and Regulations, ensuring clarity and effectiveness in regulatory frameworks. he played a crucial role in finalizing proposed legislation aimed at modernizing Guam customs border laws, covering various aspects such as Powers of Customs Officers, Definitions,

Places of Inspection, Guard on Vessels, and Release of Sealed Cargo; and

WHEREAS, he reviewed and proposed draft language for the Administrative Rules and Regulations, contributing to the completion of the Customs Manifest Public Law and ensuring regulatory compliance within the agency. He conducted a thorough examination of the memorandum of understanding (MOU) between the Customs Agency and the United States Postal Inspection Service Task Force, which is essential for the effective operation of the Guam Interagency Narcotics Task Force (GIANT), whose primary mission is to thwart the infiltration of drugs via the United States Postal Service; and

WHERAS, he reviewed and contributed insights to the Port Security Grant program, focusing on resource allocation, closed circuit surveillance of the maritime port of entry, drone technology utilization, and priority area establishment to enhance port security measures.

WHEREAS, he took direct charge of the revitalization efforts at the on-island Guam Customs Canine Training Academy, ensuring operational improvements and successful graduation of seven proficient Drug Detector Dog Handlers, thereby enhancing narcotics detection capabilities. Additionally, he authored the Customs COVID-19 Mission document, which served as a foundational blueprint for navigating the unprecedented challenges posed by the global pandemic, ensuring operational continuity and the safety of personnel within the agency; and

WHERAES, he conducted thorough analyses of key directives and memos, including DPHSS GUIDANCE-MEMO-2020-11-REV-11-05-14-21-FINAL and EO 2021-10, to assess their impact on ABWIAT Operations, ensuring compliance and efficiency in border enforcement procedures. He also addressed critical issues such as hazardous duty historical memorandum directives, container seal violations, and the allocation of Customs Captains, demonstrating his proactive approach to problem-solving and commitment to improving operational effectiveness; and

WHEREAS, he performed direct oversight and management of various programs and initiatives, including the development and establishment of multiple customs programs such as the Guam Customs Detector Dog Unit Program, the Guam Customs Canine Training Academy, Biosecurity Task Force, Maritime Contraband Enforcement Team, Fines, Fees, and Forfeitures Section, and the Guam Customs Agriculture Canine Unit, showcasing his innovative leadership and dedication to enhancing border security measures. He simultaneously served with distinction in the Guam Air National Guard for over twenty years, retiring as the seventh Command Chief and demonstrating a steadfast commitment to serving both his country and his community with honor and distinction; and

WHEREAS, he is a highly educated professional, as he holds a Professional Master's Degree in Business Administration from the University of Guam, earned through the prestigious Doc Sanchez Scholarship. He also holds a Bachelor of Science in Global Business Management from the University of Phoenix, graduating with honors, and Associate Degrees in Mechanical and Electrical Technology, and Human Resource Management from the University of the Air Force. Illustrating his diverse educational background and expertise in various disciplines; and

WHEREAS, he has demonstrated his scholarly contributions by publishing academic work in a Peer Reviewed Journal and served as a presenter for the International Conference on Business, Economics, and Information Technology (ICBEIT) in 2015, highlighting his expertise and thought leadership in academic circles; and

WHEREAS, he has been recognized for his leadership and service, serving as the President of the Guam Air National Guard Top 3 Association in 2012 and earning distinctions such as making the Dean's List for the 2014 Fall Semester at the University of Guam. He has received numerous accolades and awards throughout his career, including being named the Air National Guard First Sergeant of the Year during the

early stage in his Air National Guard career, as he was recognized as the Top Graduate

in the six-month long US Air Force Electrical Systems Apprentice Course in February

WHEREAS, he has consistently demonstrated outstanding leadership and managerial skills, as evidenced by his role as Supervisor for the Unit of the Year in 1998 and his receipt of the Outstanding Customs Officer of the Year award in December 1990 and December 1991, along with the Outstanding Team Award from the Australian Customs Detector Dog Training Center in September 1989; and

WHEREAS, in honoring Chief Philip S.N. Taijeron, Jr., we celebrate a remarkable career dedicated to the safety, security, and well-being of our community. For over four decades, Chief Taijeron's tireless efforts and exceptional leadership have been instrumental in safeguarding Guam's borders and upholding the rule of law. As he embarks on a well-deserved retirement, we commend his profound impact and express our gratitude for his unwavering commitment to our island home. His legacy will continue to inspire future generations; now therefore, be it
