In 1949, Cathedral Grade School (CGS) became the first Catholic elementary school on Guam and was administered by Sister Mary Inez Underwood, a Sister of Mercy from Belmont, North Carolina; and in 1989, the school moved and changed its name to Bishop Baumgartner Memorial Catholic School (BBMCS), and it continues to be a school community that leads students to holistic excellence, to love all of God's creation, and to live the Gospel of Jesus Christ; and
