BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH COMMENTS ON BILL NO. <u>162-37 (LS)</u>

The proposed legislation intends to amend subsections (b)(1) and (b)(4) and to repeal subsections (b)(2 - 3), subsections (b)(5 - 8) and the entirety of subsections (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g) of 3218.1 of Chapter 3, Article 2, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated relative to updating the Women's Reproductive Health Act of 2022. The intent of the proposed legislation is to update the legal framework for the availability of safe and accessible abortion service in Guam. This will allow a safeguarding of individual rights, promote equality in public health, and respect for personal autonomy.

The proposed legislation intends to create more accessibility to procedural abortions in Guam, by allowing qualified physicians to meet with patients either in person or through virtual medical consultation. Additionally, the proposed legislation seeks to repeal multiple subsections of the law that pose a grave risk for unsafe, clandestine medical procedures.

Absent information from the Department of Public Health and Social Services relative to the cost and implementation of virtual medical consultations, the Bureau is unable to determine an estimated financial impact on the Government of Guam.

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
