SPEAKER TERLAJE: *I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN* IS CALLED TO ORDER MAJORITY LEADER SENATOR SHELTON, YOU ARE RECOGNIZED.

SENATOR SHELTON: GOOD MORNING *BUENAS* SPEAKER AND COLLEAGUES I MOVE TO ADOPT TODAY'S LEGISLATIVE SESSION AGENDA DATED NOVEMBER 3RD 2023.

SPEAKER TERLAJE: A MOTION WAS MADE TO TO ADOPT THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION AGENDA DATED NOVEMBER 3RD IS THERE ANY OBJECTION SEEING NO OBJECTION MOTION CARRIES MAJORITY LEADER YOU ARE RECOGNIZED.

NOTE SPEAKER TERLAJE PRESIDES OVER THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

SPEAKER TERLAJE: THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE OF *I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN* IS CALLED TO ORDER ON BEHALF OF ALL MEMBERS OF THE 37TH GUAM LEGISLATURE I WOULD LIKE TO WELCOME OUR GOVERNOR HER LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR CHIEF JUSTICE MARAMAN THE MAYORS COUNCIL OF GUAM FORMER ELECTED LEADERS MEMBERS OF OUR CONSULATE CORPS REPRESENTATIVES FROM JOINT REGION MARIANAS AND ALL OF OUR HONORED GUESTS AND OF COURSE THE FAMILY WE ARE GOING TO TOLL THE BELLS IN HONOR AND WELCOME THE LATE HONORABLE JOAQUIN GUERRERO TOPASÑA FORMER MAYOR OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF *HÁGAT* AND HIS FAMILY HE WILL BE ESCORTED FIRST BY GUAM'S PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS AND THEN THE MAYORS COUNCIL OF GUAM AND INTO THE SESSION HALL BY MEMBERS OF THE 37TH GUAM LEGISLATURE PLEASE RISE FOR THE TOLLING OF THE BELLS PLEASE REMAIN STANDING AS WE BEGIN THE PRESENTATION OF COLORS BY THE GUAM PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS I CALL UPON MAX MAFNAS TO LEAD IN THE SINGING OF THE NATIONAL ANTHEM AND THE SINGING OF THE GUAM HYMN.

MAX MAFNAS: O SAY CAN YOU SEE, BY THE DAWN'S EARLY LIGHT, WHAT SO PROUDLY WE HAIL'D AT THE TWILIGHT'S LAST GLEAMING, WHOSE BROAD STRIPES AND BRIGHT STARS THROUGH THE PERILOUS FIGHT O'ER THE RAMPARTS WE WATCH'D WERE SO GALLANTLY STREAMING AND THE ROCKET'S RED GLARE, THE BOMBS BURSTING IN AIR, GAVE PROOF THROUGH THE NIGHT THAT OUR FLAG WAS STILL THERE, O SAY DOES THAT STAR-SPANGLED BANNER YET WAVE O'ER THE LAND OF THE FREE AND THE HOME OF THE BRAVE.

SENATOR SHELTON: RESOLUTION NUMBER 238-37 LS INTRODUCED BY THERESE M. TERLAJE TINA ROSE MUÑA BARNES CHRIS BARNETT FRANK BLAS, JR. CHRISTOPHER M. DUEÑAS JESSE A. LUJAN WILLIAM A. PARKINSON SABINA FLORES PEREZ ROY A. B. QUINATA JOE S. SAN AUGUSTIN DWAYNE T.D. SAN NICOLAS AMANDA L. SHELTON TELO T. TAITAGUE THOMAS J. FISHER RELATIVE TO POSTHUMOUSLY RECOGNIZING THE LATE HONORABLE †JOAQUIN GUERRERO TOPASNA, FORMER MAYOR OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF HĀGAT, FOR HIS DEDICATION TO THE ISLAND AND PEOPLE OF GUAM, AND COMMEMORATING HIS LEGACY OF SERVICE; AND EXPRESSING CONDOLENCES TO HIS FAMILY ON HIS PASSING, ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF GUAM BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUĀHAN* WHEREAS, THE LATE HONORABLE †JOAQUIN GUERRERO TOPASNA WAS BORN ON FEBRUARY 16, 1936, IN *TUTUJAN, SINAJANA*; HE IS THE MIDDLE SON OF THE LATE †JESUS AGUON TOPASNA AND †DOLORES TENORIO GUERRERO; AND HIS MATERNAL GRANDPARENTS ARE †IGNACIO LEON GUERRERO GUERRERO AND †ROSA DUENAS TENORIO (*FAMILIAN KORINCHO*); AND THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA GREW UP ALONG WITH HIS SIBLINGS JOSE, FRANCISCO, ANA, MARGARITA, ROSA, PEDRO, AND IGNACIO IN *TUTUJAN* DURING THE JAPANESE OCCUPATION; AND THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA'S FATHER JESUS AND TWO (2) OF HIS SIBLINGS, PEDRO AND IGNACIO, DID NOT SURVIVE THE JAPANESE OCCUPATION; AND SOMETIME AFTER THE LIBERATION OF GUAM IN WORLD WAR II, JOAQUIN'S MOTHER DOLORES GUERRERO TOPASNA MARRIED DAVID PANGELINAN, AND THE FAMILY REMAINED IN *TUTUJAN*; AND THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA WAS NOT ABLE TO COMPLETE HIS HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION, AND IN DECEMBER 1953, HE ENLISTED IN THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS (USMC) AT THE AGE OF SEVENTEEN (17) AND WENT THROUGH HIS BASIC TRAINING AT THE MARINE CORPS RECRUIT DEPOT IN SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA. IN JULY 1954, HE REPORTED TO THE WEAPONS COMPANY, SECOND (2ND) BATTALION, SEVENTH (7TH) MARINE REGIMENT, FIRST (1ST) MARINE DIVISION IN KOREA; AND IN JULY 1956, HE WAS ASSIGNED TO THE MARINE BARRACKS AT NAVAL BASE SUBIC BAY IN THE PHILIPPINES; AND IN 1957, THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA RETURNED HOME TO GUAM TO FINISH HIS REMAINING MILITARY OBLIGATION AND SEPARATED FROM THE U.S. MARINE CORPS WITH THE RANK OF LANCE CORPORAL. LATER THAT YEAR, HE MARRIED MARIA CARBULLIDO PINAULA OF *HĀGAT*, AND THEY LIVED IN *AGAÑA HEIGHTS* UNTIL THE ONSLAUGHT OF SUPER TYPHOON KAREN IN 1962, WHICH SEVERELY DAMAGED THEIR HOME. THEY MOVED TO *HĀGAT* IN 1963, WHERE THEY BUILT THEIR HOME AND RAISED TEN (10) CHILDREN - JESSE, KENNETH, FRANKLIN, MICHAEL, GEORGE, EDWARD, DAVID, GERALDINE, BARBARA, AND DOREEN; AND AFTER SERVING IN THE MILITARY, THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA WORKED AT THE U.S. NAVAL STATION PUBLIC WORKS CENTER (PWC), AND HE SOMETIMES WORKED AS A PART-TIME SECURITY GUARD. HE LATER WORKED AT THE U.S. NAVAL STATION SHIP REPAIR FACILITY (SRF) AND SERVED AS A FEDERAL CIVIL SERVANT FOR NEARLY THREE (3) DECADES; AND THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA WAS AN ACTIVE MEMBER OF THE COMMUNITY OF *HĀGAT*. HE COACHED THE *HĀGAT* ESSO AND *HĀGAT* TOWN HOUSE LITTLE LEAGUE TEAMS; AND IN 1971, HE WAS AN ASSISTANT COACH FOR THE GUAM LITTLE LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM, REPRESENTING THE UNITED STATES AT THE FAR EAST TOURNAMENT IN TAIWAN; AND THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA WAS THE SCOUTMASTER FOR THE *HĀGAT* BOY SCOUT TROOP 30 AND SUPPORTED THE *HĀGAT* CUB SCOUT PACK; AND HE ALSO SUPPORTED THE MOUNT CARMEL CHURCH ALTAR BOYS PROGRAM, WITH SEVEN (7) OF HIS SONS SERVING IN THE PROGRAM. HE WAS A MOUNT CARMEL PARISH COUNCIL MEMBER FOR MANY YEARS, A MEMBER OF THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS, AND A VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS (VFW) COMMANDER FOR POST NO. 2917; AND IN 1976, ANOTHER DISASTER, SUPER TYPHOON PAMELA, STRUCK GUAM; AND AGAIN HIS FAMILY LOST NEARLY EVERYTHING, BUT THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA DID NOT LET THIS SITUATION KEEP HIM DOWN, AND AFTER A SHORT STAY AT THE *HĀGAT* TEACHERS' HOUSING, HE AND HIS CHILDREN BUILT A TEMPORARY HOME USING RECYCLED WOOD AND CORRUGATED ROOFING MATERIALS UNTIL A NEW ONE WAS BUILT; AND IN 1978, THEY MOVED INTO THEIR NEW HOME THAT STILL STANDS TODAY; AND SERVING THE ISLAND AND THE PEOPLE OF GUAM FOR MANY YEARS WITH THE GUAM POLICE RESERVE, THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA RETIRED IN 1988 AS A MAJOR. AFTER HIS DEDICATED SERVICE WITH THE U.S. NAVY SRF, THE LATE HONORABLE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA PURSUED A CAREER IN GOVERNMENT AND POLITICS; AND IN 1993, HE WAS ELECTED TO SERVE AS THE VICE MAYOR OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF *HĀGAT*; AND IN 1996, HE WAS ELECTED TO SERVE AS THE MAYOR OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF *HĀGAT*, WHERE HE SERVED UNTIL 1997. IN 1995, HE PARTICIPATED IN THE U.S. NAVAL BASE SHIP REPAIR FACILITY BASE REALIGNMENT AND CLOSURE (BRAC) PROCESS. AFTER HIS TENURE AS VICE MAYOR AND MAYOR OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF *HĀGAT*, HE RETIRED FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM IN 2002; AND IN 2006, THE LATE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA LOST HIS WIFE OF FORTY-NINE (49) YEARS, MARIA CARBULLIDO PINAULA; AND BESIDES THEIR TEN (10) CHILDREN, THEY WERE BLESSED WITH FORTY-NINE (49) GRANDCHILDREN, EIGHTY-FIVE (85)

GREAT-GRANDCHILDREN, AND ELEVEN (11) GREAT-GREAT-GRANDCHILDREN; AND IN 2018, THE LATE HONORABLE †JOAQUIN TOPASNA MARRIED GEMMALYN BICOS, AND THEY HAVE A SON, JOKIN TOPASNA, AND A STEPSON, GABRIEL MEMPIN; NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT *I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÁHAN* DOES HEREBY, ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF GUAM, POSTHUMOUSLY RECOGNIZE THE LATE HONORABLE †JOAQUIN GUERRERO TOPASNA, FORMER MAYOR OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF *HÁGAT*, FOR HIS DEDICATION TO THE ISLAND AND PEOPLE OF GUAM, AND COMMEMORATE HIS LEGACY OF SERVICE; AND EXPRESS CONDOLENCES TO HIS FAMILY ON HIS PASSING, ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF GUAM; AND BE IT FURTHER THAT THE SPEAKER CERTIFY, AND THE LEGISLATIVE SECRETARY ATTEST TO, THE ADOPTION HEREOF, AND THAT COPIES OF THE SAME BE THEREAFTER TRANSMITTED TO GEMMALYN B. GOVERNOR TENORIO SPEAKER TERLAJE ASSOCIATE JUSTICE MARAMAN SENATORS JUDGES DISTINGUISHED GUESTS FATHER FAMILY AND FRIENDS ON BEHALF OF THE TOPASÑA FAMILY THANK YOU FOR COMING TOGETHER IN THIS CHAMBER TO REMEMBER AND HONOR OUR LATE FATHER JOAQUIN GUERRERO TOPASÑA I WOULD NOT WANT TO REPEAT EVERYTHING THAT WAS READ EARLIER BUT ALLOW ME TO READ VERSES IN 2 SAMUEL 7:14-15 I WILL BE A FATHER TO HIM AND HE WILL BE A SON TO ME WHEN HE DOES WRONG I WILL DISCIPLINE HIM IN THE USUAL WAY THE PITFALLS AND OBSTACLES OF THIS MORTAL LIFE BUT I'LL NEVER REMOVE MY GRACIOUS LOVE FOR HIM AS YOU KNOW MY FATHER WAS BORN PRIOR TO THE JAPANESE INVASION AND OCCUPATION MY GRANDFATHER AND MY GRANDMOTHER WERE HUMBLE PEOPLE HE WAS A FARMER AND SHE WAS A LAUNDRESS BUT THEY RAISED LOVING FAMILY KNOWING MY FATHER AS A YOUNG BOY HE WAS ENERGETIC AND MISCHIEVOUS HE WAS 5 YEARS OLD DURING THE INVASION AND OCCUPATION AND I'M SURE HE WAS A HANDFUL TO MY GRANDPARENTS AS WELL AS HIS OLDER SIBLINGS BECAUSE HE WAS TOO YOUNG TO WORK IN THE FIELDS DO ANY OTHER LABOR DETAILS OR ATTEND A JAPANESE SCHOOL SO SOMEONE HAS TO KEEP HIM OUT OF TROUBLE HIS FATHER DIED FROM THE MILITARY ACTIONS BETWEEN THE JAPANESE AND THE US FORCES DOING THE LIBERATION AFTER THE LIBERATION AND DAD FACED CHALLENGES BETWEEN ATTENDING SCHOOL AND FINDING WORK TO HELP THE FAMILY SINCE HE IS ONE OF TWO BOYS IN THE FAMILY AS YOU KNOW HE ENLISTED IN MARINE CORPS PROUD TO BE IN THE MARINE CORPS I RECALL GROWING UP WHEN HE WAS WORKING AT AS A PART-TIME SECURITY GUARD FOR THE GATE WITH THE MARINES AND THE NAVY AND YOU HAVE ALL HIS BOYS COME TOGETHER AND SHINE SHOES BUT NONE OF US CAN MATCH HIS SKILL IN SHINING SHOES THAT'S ONLY BUILT IN INGRAINED IN A MARINE WHEN HE WAS WE HAVE PICTURES OF HIM WHEN HE WAS ASSIGNED TO SUBIC BAY THERE HE WAS ALSO A SENTINEL AT THE A SENTRY AT THE ENTRANCE TO THE NAVAL BASE WHEN HE SEPARATED FROM THE MARINE CORPS IN 1957 HE WAS AWARDED THE NATIONAL DEFENSE SERVICE MEDAL THE UNITED NATIONS SERVICE MEDAL AND THE KOREAN SERVICE MEDAL AFTER TYPHOON KAREN WE DECIDE TO THEY DECIDE TO MOVE TO *AGAT* MY FATHER NEVER COMPLETED HIGH SCHOOL BECAUSE OF THE WAY THE HIGH THE SCHOOLING SYSTEM BACK THEN THAT YOU CAN ONLY ACHIEVE EIGHTH GRADE DURING THAT TIME SO HE STRUGGLED TO BUILD THE HOME AND WHATEVER BOYS THAT HE HAS THAT ARE ABLE BODY WE WORK WITH TRY TO BUILD UP OUR HOME USING WOOD 2X4S ANYTHING HE CAN FIND HE DIDN'T HAVE THE RESOURCES LIKE WE HAVE NOWADAYS THE LIVING ROOM WE MADE MADE OUT OF PLYWOOD THE BED ROOMS WILL HAVE 2X6 IS 2X 12 WITH GAPS IN



Relative to posthumously recognizing the late Honorable Joaquin Guerrero Topasna, former Mayor of the Municipality of Hagåtña, for his dedication to the island and people of Guam, and commemorating his legacy of service; and expressing condolences to his family on his passing, on behalf of the people of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINUTRENTAI SHIETI NA LIHESLATURAN GUĀHAM:

WHEREAS the late Honorable Joaquin Guerrero Topasna was born on February 16, 1936, in Tapan, England, he is the middle son of the late Heron Agoson Topasna and Dolores Tenorio Guerrero, and his maternal grandparents are Higinio Leon Guerrero Guerrero and Rosa Dolores Tenorio (Gualtan Karabid); and

WHEREAS the late Joaquin Topasna grew up along with his siblings Jose, Francisco, Ana, Margarita, Rosa, Pablo, and Ignacio in Tapan during the Japanese occupation; and

WHEREAS the late Joaquin Topasna's father Jose and two (2) of his siblings, Pablo and Ignacio, did not survive the Japanese occupation; and sometime after the Liberation of Guam in World War II, Joaquin's mother Dolores Guerrero married David Pangulonan, and the family remained in Tapan; and

WHEREAS the late Joaquin Topasna was not able to complete his high school education; and in December 1953, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps (USMC) at the age of seventeen (17), and went through his basic training at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in San Diego, California. In July 1954, he reported to the Weapons Company, Second (2nd) Battalion, Seventh (7th) Marine Regiment, First (1st) Marine Division in Korea; and in July 1956, he was assigned to the Marine Barracks at Naval Base Subic Bay in the Philippines; and

WHEREAS in 1957, the late Joaquin Topasna returned home to Guam to finish his remaining military obligation and separated from the U.S. Marine Corps with the rank of Lance Corporal. Later that year, he married Maria Carballido Pinaula of Hagåtña, and they lived in Agaña Heights until the onslaught of Super Typhoon Karen in 1962, which severely damaged their home. They moved to Hagåtña in 1963, where they built their home and raised ten (10) children - Jesse, Kenneth, Franklin, Michael, George, Edward, David, Geraldine, Barbara, and Doreen; and

WHEREAS, after serving in the military, the late Joaquin Topasna worked at the U.S. Naval Station Public Works Center (PWC), and he sometimes worked as a part-time security guard. He later worked at the U.S. Naval Station Ship Repair Facility (SRF) and served as a federal civil servant for nearly three (3) decades; and

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Topasna was an active member of the community of Hagåtña. He coached the Hagåtña Boys and Hagåtña Town House Little League teams; and in 1971, he was an Assistant Coach for the Guam Little League Championship Team, representing the United States at the Far East Tournament in Taiwan; and

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Topasna was the Scoutmaster for the Hagåtña Boy Scout Troop 30 and supported the Hagåtña Cub Scout pack; and he also supported the Mount Carmel Church Altar Boys program, with seven (7) of his sons serving in the program. He was a Mount Carmel Parish Council member for many years; a member of the Knights of Columbus, and a Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Commandeer for Post No. 2917; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, another disaster, Super Typhoon Pamela, struck Guam, and upon his family but nearly everything; but the late Joaquin Topasna did not let this misfortune keep him down, and after a short stay at the Hagåtña teachers' housing, he and his children built a temporary home using recycled wood and corrugated roofing materials until a new one was built; and in 1978, they moved into their new home that still stands today; and

WHEREAS, serving the island and the people of Guam for many years with the Guam Police Reserve, the late Joaquin Topasna retired in 1988 as a Major. After his dedicated service with the U.S. Navy SRP; the late Honorable Joaquin Topasna pursued a career in government and politics; and in 1993, he was elected to serve as the Vice Mayor of the Municipality of Hagåtña; and in 1996, he was elected to serve as the Mayor of the Municipality of Hagåtña, where he served until 1997. In 1995, he participated in the U.S. Naval Base Ship Repair Facility Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) process. After his tenure as Vice Mayor and Mayor of the Municipality of Hagåtña, he retired from the Government of Guam in 2002; and

WHEREAS, in 2006, the late Joaquin Topasna lost his wife of forty-nine (49) years, Maria Carballido Pinaula; and besides their ten (10) children, they were blessed with forty-nine (49) grandchildren, eighty-five (85) great-grandchildren, and eleven (11) great-great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, the late Honorable Joaquin Topasna married Gemmalyn Bicos, and they have a son, Jokin Topasna, and a stepson, Gabriel Mempo; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that I Minutrentai Shieta Na Liheslaturan Guaham does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, posthumously recognize the late Honorable Joaquin Guerrero Topasna, former Mayor of the Municipality of Hagåtña, for his dedication to the island and people of Guam, and commemorate his legacy of service; and express condolences to his family on his passing, on behalf of the people of Guam; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be therewith transmitted to Gemmalyn B. PROCLAIMING NOVEMBER 3, 2023, RECOGNIZING THE LATE HONORABLE JOAQUIN GUERRERO TOPASNA FOR HIS SERVICE TO THE PEOPLE AND THE ISLAND OF GUAM.

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Joaquin Guerrero Topasna, originally from Tapan, Sinajana, was born on February 16, 1936 to the late Jesus Agoson Topasna and Dolores Tenorio Guerrero. He married the late Maria Carballido Pinaula and had 10 children: Jesse, Kenneth, Franklin, Michael, George, Edward, David, Geraldine, Barbara, and Doreen. In 2018 he remarried to Gemmalyn Bicos and had a son, Jokin Topasna, and a stepson, Gabriel Mempo. He was blessed with 49 grandchildren, 85 great-grandchildren, and 11 great-great-grandchildren;

WHEREAS, as a World War II survivor, the late Joaquin Topasna lost his father and two of his siblings: Pedro and Ignacio during the Japanese occupation of Guam;

WHEREAS, long after the war, in 1953, at the age of 17, he joined the United States Marine Corps (USMC) and completed his basic training in San Diego, California's Marine Corps Recruit Depot;

WHEREAS, in 1954, the late Joaquin Topasna became a part of the Weapons Company, Second Battalion, Seventh Marine Regiment, First Marine Division deployed in Korea. Two years later, in 1956, he was ordered to the Philippines as part of the Marine Barracks at Naval Base Subic Bay;

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Topasna returned to the island of Guam in 1957 with the rank of Lance Corporal and lived with his wife, Maria, and their 10 children in the village of Hagåtña after Super Typhoon Karen;

WHEREAS, since returning to the island, the late Joaquin Topasna continued his ties with the military and worked in the U.S. Naval Station Public Works Center, the U.S. Naval Station Ship Repair Facility (SRF) and was a federal civil servant for three decades;

WHEREAS, as a member of the island community, the late Joaquin Topasna served as the Scoutmaster for the Hagåtña Boy Scout Troop 30 and was a part of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Commandeer for Post No. 2917. He was a strong advocate for the church as he was a supporter of the Mount Carmel Church Altar Boys program, a Mount Carmel Parish Council member, and a member of the Knights of Columbus;

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Topasna's early service to the people was under the the Guam Police Reserve where he retired as a Major in 1988;

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Topasna then followed the path of politics and served as Vice Mayor of the Municipality of Hagåtña in 1993, and from 1996 to 1997 he served as the Mayor of the Municipality of Hagåtña. He retired from the Government of Guam in 2002; and

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Topasna had a passion for public service and made many contributions to our island community and the Nation. As a community, we are eternally grateful and reflect on his life and service.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LOURDES A. LEON GUERRERO, Maga'ahga Guåhan, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, do hereby call on the people of Guam to join us in recognizing the life and legacy of the late Honorable Joaquin Guerrero Topasna.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, JOSHUA F. TENORIO, Segundo Maga'ahga Guåhan, Lieutenant Governor of Guam, hereby, together with the Maga'ahga, cause the Great Seal of Guam to be affixed in the Capital City of Hagåtña, on this Third day of November in the Year of our Lord, Anno Domini, Two Thousand and Twenty-Three.
