AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW ARTICLE 4 TO CHAPTER 18 OF TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO MANDATING ELECTRONIC REPORTING FOR ALL GOVERNMENT OF GUAM ENTITIES.

#### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 **Findings Section 1.** Legislative and Intent. Transparency 3 accountability are two (2) of the most important values when it comes to governing. 4 When citizens have access to information about their government, they can make informed decisions and hold their leaders accountable for their actions. Therefore, 5 6 the government of Guam has taken steps to increase transparency and accountability with the release of Report 22-07. 7 8 The report recommends that all written reports be converted into electronic

forms to better ensure transparency and accountability within the government. By

making these documents more accessible, citizens will be able to easily find out what

1 is going on in their local government, as well as any potential missteps or

2 wrongdoings that may occur. Furthermore, by having a record of every transaction

3 made available online, elected officials will be held responsible for any unethical

behavior or misuse of public funds. The importance of this cannot be overstated;

without transparency and accountability in our governmental systems, we could not

trust those who lead us nor ensure that our laws are being followed properly.

**Section 2.** A new Article 4 is hereby *added* to Chapter 18 of Title 1, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"ARTICLE 4

## ELECTRONIC REPORTING BY ALL GOVERNMENT OF GUAM ENTITIES

§ 1840. Electronic Reporting by All Government of Guam Entities.

§ 1840. Electronic Reporting by All Government of Guam Entities.

Except for reports or information that would violate the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), and/or the disclosure of which is otherwise restricted by law, such as, but not limited to, victims report of suspected child abuse, sexual assault, elderly abuse, and family violence, all government of Guam line agencies, including autonomous and semi-autonomous agencies and the Judiciary of Guam, shall submit reports required by law to *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, the Public Auditor, and the Attorney General of Guam via electronic mail. Electronic reporting shall mean posting the report on the agency's respective website with a notification sent via email, with the report attached, to *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*, the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, the Public Auditor, the Attorney General of Guam, and any other entity as mandated by law."

Section 3. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.

**Section 4. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
